

Parish Survey Update Church Building

Pastor's Column

The following is a restatement of a letter written by Bishop Gainer in October 2021 about Pope Francis inaugurating a **two-year synodal process** leading the whole Church toward the Synod of the People of God scheduled for October 2023. Synod is Greek which we translate "together on the way." Synods have been held locally and universally throughout the history of the Church. The Holy Father wants to include all the members of the Church in this process of "journeying together." At its core this process is about listening to each other, but even more, listening to the voice of the Lord speaking to us through the Sacred Scriptures, the grace of the Sacraments and the movement of the Holy Spirit in our hearts.

In the Diocese of Harrisburg we are to gather together in **prayerful listening**. Each parish will engage in this effort led by their Pastoral Council members in consultation with their Pastor. The goal is not to achieve consensus or arrive at a specific action plan for change, but to hear how the Holy Spirit is speaking in and through us in the Church today.

In St. Joseph Parish the Parish Pastoral Council has decided to give parishioners **two options to answer four questions**. A paper survey of the questions will be handed out after Masses on March 26-27 and collected the following weekend in boxes at the exits. The surveys do not ask for a signature/name. What is requested is that you prayerfully ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in answering the questions. That is the first option.

The second option allows for speaking and listening in a group setting. If you wish to present your answers and hear how other parishioners have answered the same questions take your completed survey sheet to the social hall immediately after any of the Masses on April 2-3. There Parish Pastoral Council members will form and coordinate **small group listening sessions**. Each person in the group will have an allotted period of time to share his/her answers to the four questions and then politely listen to how others have answered the questions. The Parish Pastoral Council members are not there to respond to your answers but only to accurately gather them.

In the social hall we will begin with a prayer invoking the Holy Spirit to guide us. The Word of God will be proclaimed followed by a brief period of silence and then a few instructions given outlining the group process. Small groups will then be formed for the listening sessions. Once they are completed we will gather as one larger group for feedback. The session will close with prayer. The time involved will be approximately an hour.

The answers to the questions will be consolidated into categories and forwarded to the diocesan office.

Thank you for your participation in this synodal process of "journeying together."




