

Points to Prayerfully Ponder

Scripture: They said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So, what do you say?" ... (He) said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." ...they went away one by one...and (Jesus) said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "No one, sir." Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore."

Points to Prayerfully Ponder:

What are some of the ways that I can do more to show Jesus how thankful I am for his mercy and forgiveness? What (sinful) thoughts or acts in my life stand in the way of my relationships with others? How do my deep, unresolved issues prevent me from becoming the person Jesus is calling me to be? In which areas of my life do I need to ask for mercy and forgiveness? Is there someone in my life who is awaiting my mercy and forgiveness? Why can sharing my faith with others help them on their journey towards mercy? How will I continue to draw closer to God in this sacred Lenten Season?

Thanks to all who made this possible, especially Mrs. White, Mrs. Gilbert, Ken and Pam Carta, Michelle Dyson and MaryKate Catlin.

Thanks to the members of the Holy Name Society for providing a **St. Patrick's Day dinner** on March 17. There was plenty of food and the corned beef was tender and tasty. While everyone was eating and socializing the Holy Name members were busy cooking and serving. After expenses they even made a profit of \$480.00.

On Saturday, March 26, 65 children made their **First Holy Communion**. It was a special day for the whole parish as parents, grandparents and extended family and friends all gathered in a prayer of thanksgiving to Our Lord. I say thanksgiving because that is one of the definitions of Eucharist, it is a thanksgiving for what God has done on our behalf; we are to become a person of thanksgiving each day of our lives. Bishop Fulton Sheen said, "Thanksgiving comes late in the year. Thanksgiving comes late in some people's lives." Preaching the homily at this First Holy Communion Mass Fr. Rothan said in Spanish, speaking to the parents about this special day, "This is not simply a day in the life of your child or you. This is the beginning of the next part of their journey. A journey, with your help, which will ultimately lead to God."

Thanks to Mrs. White and Mr. Staub for overseeing the preparation of these students to receive Holy Communion. The teachers and catechists did a great job in teaching these young students about the Holy Eucharist and the proper and reverent way to receive the consecrated host, which once was simple bread and wine but by the prayer of the priest repeating the words of Jesus at the Last Supper and the decent of the Holy Spirit become the Body and Blood of Christ.

The early Church believed in the **Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist**. As St. Justin Martyr (100-165) tells us, the Eucharist was not understood as ordinary food. "We do not consume the Eucharistic bread and wine as if it were ordinary food and drink, for we have been taught that as Jesus Christ our savior became a man of flesh and blood by the power of the word of God so also the food that our flesh and blood assimilates for its nourishment becomes the flesh and blood of the incarnate Jesus by the power of his own words contained in the prayer of Thanksgiving."

The Holy Eucharist we receive this and every Sunday in the Catholic Church is the same Eucharist described by St. Justin Martyr. What the early Church believed then we believe now. What they received, we receive...The Body and Blood of Christ. "Oh Sacrament Most Holy, O Sacrament Divine! All praise and all thanksgiving, be every moment thine."




