

Points to Prayerfully Ponder

Scripture: When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him and the criminals there, one on his right, the other on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."

Luke 23:33-34

Points to Prayerfully Ponder:

In The Our Father we ask God to forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who have trespassed against us. Why do I find it so hard to forgive people who have harmed me? Who do I need to forgive? When have I asked God to help me forgive those who do me harm? Who have I harmed and how have I asked them to forgive me?

Pastor's Column

Today is **Passion (Palm) Sunday** which joins the foretelling of Christ's regal triumph and proclamation of the Passion. It is the beginning of Holy Week, during which the Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation accomplished by Christ in the last days of his life on earth, beginning with his messianic entrance into Jerusalem.

Tomorrow, Monday of Holy Week, Bishop Gainer will celebrate the Chrism Mass at which the Holy Chrism is consecrated and the oils blessed. The Holy Oils will be brought back to the parishes for the Mass of the Lord's Supper, where in procession they are placed in the ambry.

The Lenten season lasts until Thursday of this week. The Easter Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, is continued through Good Friday with the celebration of the Passion of the Lord and Holy Saturday, to reach its summit in the Easter Vigil. Except in the danger of death Baptisms and Confirmation are not celebrated on these days since they have their natural place in the Easter Vigil. The Easter Triduum is also called "the triduum of the crucified, buried and risen" because during these three days is celebrated the Paschal mystery, that is, the passing of the Lord from this world to his Father.

On Holy Thursday the Church recalls the Last Supper, in which the Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, loving unto the end his own who were in the world, he offered to the Father his Body and Blood under the species of bread and wine and gave them to the Apostles as spiritual nourishment and he commanded them and their successors in the priesthood to perpetuate this offering.

On Good Friday the Church meditates on the Passion of her Lord and Spouse, venerates the Cross, commemorates her origin from the side of Christ on the Cross, and intercedes for the salvation of the whole world. On this day, in accordance with ancient tradition, the Church does not celebrate the Mass but Holy Communion is distributed to the faithful during the celebration of the Lord's Passion. Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence; it is also recommended that on Holy Saturday the paschal fast be observed to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more deeply in his resurrection.


On Holy Saturday the Church is as it were at the Lord's tomb, meditating on his passion and death, and on his descent into hell, and awaiting his resurrection with prayer and fasting. Mass is not celebrated on this day. Holy Communion may only be given in the form of Viaticum, this is to a person who is dying.

The Easter Vigil commemorates that holy night when the Lord rose from the dead and is regarded as the "mother of all holy vigils." It is during this vigil the Church celebrates the sacraments of Christian initiation, that is Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist for those catechumens who have been preparing for this moment. The entire celebration takes place at night. (Here at St. Joseph Church it begins at 8:00 p.m. outside in the courtyard and concludes at approximately 10:30 p.m.).

Almost all of the above is from a Circular Letter Concerning the Preparation and Celebration of the Easter Feasts, issued by the Congregation for Divine Worship.




