


Points to Prayerfully Ponder


Scripture: I was hard pressed and was falling, but the LORD helped me. My strength and my courage is the LORD, and he has been my savior.

Pastor's Column

We need more **greeters** at the three church entrances to welcome people coming to the three weekend Masses. All you need is a smile and a "hello." You would need to arrive about 15 minutes before Mass begins, and you can pick the Mass at which you wish to serve. You would serve about once every three weeks depending on the number of volunteers. If you would like to volunteer for this welcoming ministry please contact the front desk of the parish administrative center at 717-637-5236.

Thank you to the parishioners who participated in the **synodal process** initiated by His Holiness Pope Francis. Each survey was read by one or more Parish Pastoral Council members and consolidated into subject areas. They were then reviewed at a Parish Pastoral Council meeting. After that review a report was written and sent to the Diocese of Harrisburg which will then be forwarded to Rome.

I am **grateful for our parishioners who donate to our parish** on a regular basis, as well as for those who give when they can. There are several ways you can donate. The first option is you can sign up for Parish Giving which is the electronic version, and the second option is to receive weekly envelopes. There is information in the bulletin that will point you to the right direction of giving that is most convenient for you or your family. If you have any questions, please feel free to call the parish office and they will be happy to help you explore your options!

It was brought to my attention that during the month of April we had about **10 separate invitations to give** to the parish or separate second collections. I agree with the writer; that is quite a bit. I think we have to choose. Give to the ones that mean the most to you. We may not be able to give to all of them, or we give a small amount to each. A parish does not have much control over the dates of the second collections since they are scheduled by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops or by the Diocese of Harrisburg. Lent generally has more opportunities to give than other times of the year since the emphasis in Lent is on alms giving. I admit, it looks like I'm asking for an alm and a leg. (Credit for that exceptionally bad pun goes to Fr. Miller.) Bad pun aside, I sincerely thank you for whatever amount you can give and to whichever collections you wish to support.

Thanks to the **Fun(d) committee** for their recent donations; one to Deacon Tom Aumen's mission trip to Kentucky, and the second to St. Joseph's Church in Kentucky to help the victims of the tornado. Both checks were for \$250.00. The Deb Loss Yard Sale in March made a net profit of \$1,303.61. In addition to this amount the Loss family tables made \$1,193.00. Both amounts go to the Deb Loss Scholarship Fund for students at St. Joseph School.
