



Pastor's Column

The Latino Community held a concert on May 2, and a portion of their proceeds were dedicated to the parish. I decided to allot those funds, \$283.00, for tuition assistance for Latino students to attend St. Joseph School. At the school open house on Sunday, March 27, at 1:00 p.m. six Latino students enrolled in our school for next year. We hope to increase that number.

Thanks go out to the Knights of Columbus council #871 and St. Joseph Cub Pack for their work in hosting a **Mother's Day Breakfast** last Sunday morning. Dave Zinn helped coordinate this effort between these two parish groups to make their partnered effort a success. As Dave said in an email to his brother Knights, "Our Cub Pack leaders volunteer and work with our youth week to week. Their hours of enthusiastic effort are hard to even compile at the end of a program year." Of course, it is also rare that the Knights are not mentioned in the weekly parish bulletin for the many good works in which they are constantly involved. The breakfast was very good and well attended. I think the moms appreciated it also.

"In July 2010, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) launched a national 'If You See Something,
Say Something' campaign – a simple and effective program to raise public awareness of indicators of terrorism and
terrorism-related crime and to emphasize the importance of reporting suspicious activity to the proper state and local law
enforcement authorities" (U.S. Department of Homeland Security). Unfortunately, this effective campaign slogan applies to
us as parishioners of St. Joseph Church. While we can come to church in peace and pray in peace we have to be aware these
days of something that just doesn't look right. It could be in the parking lot. It could be suspicious behavior outside or
inside the parish buildings. If one of the priests is around bring it to his attention. If not a priest then bring it to the
attention of an usher. Their team leaders have been instructed to call the local police in these situations to let these
professional law enforcement personnel handle it.

Regarding suspicious activity I know of a case in which a parishioner, this did not happen at St. Joseph Church, discovered three men in a church on a Saturday afternoon, not praying but walking and looking around the church. One of the men was drawing the interior of the church on a pad. Once they saw the parishioner in the church they immediately left. This is an example of suspicious activity. Parish personnel were notified, who then called the police. Thankfully nothing came of it, and the police were grateful they were notified.

Why do I bring this up now? Last week we were alerted by diocesan personnel that across the nation people had threatened to disrupt Catholic Masses on Mother's Day weekend protesting the possibility of the Roe vs. Wade decision, allowing abortion, being over turned by the U.S. Supreme Court. (Writing this on Mother's Day afternoon I am not aware of any disruption of Masses this weekend in the Diocese of Harrisburg.) We need not be afraid to come to church. Just be aware of what doesn't seem normal or looks out of place. "If You See Something, Say Something."






