Pastor's Column

The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary is the feast celebrated this Tuesday, May 31, commemorating the visit of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. "It was instituted in 1389 by Pope Urban VI to obtain the end of the Western schism, and it was inserted in the Roman Calendar on July 2, the date on which it had already been celebrated by the Franciscans since 1263. It has now been assigned to the last day of May, between the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord and the Birth of St. John the Baptizer, to conform more closely to the Gospel account" (Lives of the Saints, Rev. Hugo Hoever, S.O.Cist.).

"On today's Feast of the Visitation, as in every passage of the Gospel, we see Mary docile to the divine plan and with an attitude of provident love for the brethren. In fact, the humble maiden from Nazareth, still amazed at what the Angel Gabriel had announced to her—that is, that she would be the mother of the promised Messiah—learned that her elderly kinswoman Elizabeth had in her old age also conceived a son. Mary immediately set out with haste for the house of her cousin, the Evangelist notes (cf. Lk 1: 39), to offer her help at a time of special need. How can we fail to see that the hidden protagonist in the meeting between the young Mary and the by-then elderly Elizabeth is Jesus? Mary bears him in her womb as in a sacred tabernacle and offers him as the greatest gift to Zechariah, to Elizabeth, his wife, and also to the infant developing in her womb. 'Behold', the mother of John the Baptist says, 'when the voice of your greeting came to my ears, the babe in my womb leaped for joy' (Lk 1: 44). Whoever opens his heart to the Mother encounters and welcomes the Son and is pervaded by his joy. True Marian devotion never obscures or diminishes faith and love for Jesus Christ Our Savior, the one Mediator between God and mankind. On the contrary, entrustment to Our Lady is a privileged path, tested by numerous saints, for a more faithful following of the Lord. Consequently, let us entrust ourselves to her with filial abandonment." Pope Benedict XVI, 2006.

This Monday we celebrate as a nation **Memorial Day**, remembering and honoring those who died in the nation's wars. Originally the idea of General John Logan, it was a way to honor the fallen soldiers of the Civil War. The first celebration was held on May 30, 1868 at Arlington National Cemetery with a crowd of 5,000 people in attendance. The below was written by my cousin, Joe Chamberlin, in honor of Whitey, a fraternity brother of his. He broke his leg in the Corps' Basic School for Officers but insisted on another try. It was granted. His tour in Vietnam began October 11, 1967. The reference "Day is Done" is from TAPS.

2nd Lieutenant Richard Leo Schoff, USMC. Killed in Action November 1, 1967. 23 years old.

Her tiny alabaster hands gripped the pearl handle of his sheathed sabre.

"I know he's in heaven" was her mantra at the back of the church as her tears streamed down her flushed cheeks. At the cemetery his mother's cries for her eldest son pierced the brittle cold air and rifle shots drowned out sounds of traffic and the mills nearby the Homestead hill where we stood.

Then the bugler standing off to the side tried to tell us something we could not discern as he played that most solemn anthem telling us

Whitey's Day was done.


