

Dear wonderful, loving faithful friends,

I am writing to you on Thanksgiving weekend, the first Sunday of the new church year. How time flies! I remember like it was yesterday walking into the parish rectory for the first time as I became administrator of this amazing parish. Since that first moment of encounter, we have been through a lot together especially in 2020, and in the end, I believe, have become a closer family as a result. My greatest treasure is the openness you had in sharing your lives with me. From the joy of baptisms, weddings, first communions, confirmations, and our celebration of the Eucharist together to the sadness of praying by the bedside of a loved one and anointing them with the soothing oil of God's tenderness and even the grief of laying a loved one to rest in the hope of eternal life.

One of the best spiritual books I have ever read is by Benedictine Brother David Stendhal Rast entitled: "Gratefulness, the Heart of Prayer".

I thought of the words of that title as I ate turkey with Buddy, Coco and Gizmo on Thanksgiving after three truly blessed years and enter a new liturgical year. I must say the last few months have been an emotional roller coaster for us: fear, apprehension, excitement, exhaustion, being overwhelmed by love and affirmation. At times I have felt totally exhausted. However, in the midst of these feelings the one thing that has remained constant is the feeling and awareness of deep gratitude in my prayer.

I am overwhelmed with an experience of gratitude as I recall the twenty five years I have spent in Priestly ministry and the joy of the last three years as Administrator of Saint Christine's. Ministering together with the incredible, dedicated and joyful staff of our parish has been a source of joy, fulfillment and great moments of laughter.

Three years ago, I believed then, and still believe today, that God led me to Marshfield. I have always felt a pull towards this congregation and felt called to serve God together with you. For three years, we have worked side by side, continually exploring our faith. We've gathered in large groups and small to discuss our ideas about God and Jesus. We will again. We've sought to discover what it means to be a Christian. We've worshipped, worked and celebrated together. I have constantly seen God working in your midst.

The Saint Christine Parish community truly grasps the meaning of what it means to be Church; the local caring community where people know and care for one another and the community that acknowledges the brokenness of the larger world and reaches out in compassion and service.

We've come together as individuals in relationship with each other and with Jesus Christ. I thank you for the times that you invited me into your homes and into your lives; sharing with me the highs and lows that come with life. Whether its welcoming a new baby into our world or being with loved ones as they depart, it is always a privilege and a blessing to walk with you for life-changing moments.

My heart has been heavy as we have said farewell to many saints who lived and worshipped among us. Folks who have died but who remain a part of our congregation, whose presence will always be a part of this parish community. We have said goodbye to some and have welcomed many new friends into our community, who have become important and integral to the work that we do in Christ's name.

Even by Zoom, the children and youth of Saint Christine's fill me with great hope and encouragement for the future as I see them respond in faith and generosity in so many ways.

In this season of Thanksgiving, I am so very thankful for the relationships I have formed in this community and the many ways the people of this parish have helped me to grow in my relationship with God. As I always say, I am a better priest and a better man for knowing you. I will be forever grateful for your patience, understanding, faith and above all...love.

My heart is truly filled with joy. I quote Stendhal-Rast: "The root of joy is gratefulness. It is not joy that makes us grateful: it is gratitude which makes us joyful.

I am and will forever be in thanksgiving for:

- The dedication, support and laughter of the Pastoral Staff of Saint Christine's
- The uplifting and prayerful music of all involved in the Music Ministry
- The commitment and enthusiasm of the many involved in the various ministries of our parish
- The hope and energy of the people of the parish
- The gift of our children and their smiling faces and openness
- The wisdom and example of our Seniors
- The faith and dedication of the people of this parish in which I happily serve

I would like to close with one of my favorite Scripture passages from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians: 1:3-6, 9-11

"I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

**FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT
NOVEMBER 29, 2020**

Reading

Is 63:16b-17, 19b; 64:2-7

Isaiah bemoans our turning away from the Lord. Yet He gave us free will so that we should take the responsibility. We still fit the description that Isaiah has for us, being sinful and unclean. How do we keep our eyes on Him remaining respectful of God?

You, LORD, are our father, our redeemer you are named forever. Why do you let us wander, O LORD, from your ways, and harden our hearts so that we fear you not? Return for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your heritage. Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down, with the mountains quaking before you, while you wrought awesome deeds we could not hope for, such as they had not heard of from of old. No ear has ever heard, no eye ever seen, any God but you doing such deeds for those who wait for him. Would that you might meet us doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways! Behold, you are angry, and we are sinful; all of us have become like unclean people, all our good deeds are like polluted rags; we have all withered like leaves, and our guilt carries us away like the wind. There is none who calls upon your name, who rouses himself to cling to you; for you have hidden your face from us and have delivered us up to our guilt. Yet, O LORD, you are our father; we are the clay and you the potter: we are all the work of your hands.

This is one of the early references of "the son of man" by David. He asks the LORD to make him strong. This is the time of year for preparation of the coming of the Son of Man. Are you prepared for Jesus?

Reading

1 Cor 1:3-9

Paul recognizes the grace of Our Lord in the Corinthians, and thus encourages them in their wait for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. As we have learned, the time for the second coming of Jesus is not for us to know, but our preparation is necessary. How are you prepared?

Brothers and sisters:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I give thanks to my God always on your account for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus, that in him you were enriched in every way, with all discourse and all knowledge, as the testimony to Christ was confirmed among you, so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revelation of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will keep you firm to the end, irreproachable on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, and by him you were called to fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Gospel

Mk 13:33-37

Jesus is warning us "Be watchful! Be alert!" As He also warns, "May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping." How could Jesus find us sleeping? We prepare how?

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Be watchful! Be alert!

You do not know when the time will come.

It is like a man traveling abroad.

He leaves home and places his servants in charge, each with his own work,

and orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch.

Watch, therefore;

you do not know when the Lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight,

or at cockcrow, or in the morning.

May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping.

What I say to you, I say to all: "Watch!"

Some Thoughts... I have heard that if you live to be seventy years old, you will spend three years of your life just waiting. Waiting in line at the grocery store, waiting in the doctor's office, waiting for lunch to be ready, waiting for recess time at school. In his book, "Oh, the Places You'll Go," Dr. Seuss talks about a place called "the waiting place." He describes it as a useless place where people are just waiting.

Waiting for a train to go
 or a bus to come, or a plane to go
 or the mail to come, or the rain to go
 or the phone to ring, or the snow to snow
 or waiting around for a Yes or No
 or waiting for their hair to grow.
 Everyone is just waiting.

I don't particularly like waiting, do you? I don't like it, but I don't know of any way to avoid it. We all have to spend some time in this "waiting place" that Dr. Seuss talks about, but I don't think it has to be a useless place. While we are waiting, life goes on, and we must make good use of our time. What can we do? Well, we could read a good book or call a friend on the cell phone. We could make a list of things we need to do today or, we could even study for our weekly spelling test. Well, maybe that's going a bit too far, but there are many things we can do besides just waiting.

Today is the first Sunday of Advent. Advent means "to come." Do you know what's coming? Of course, Christmas is coming. This is an exciting time, but it may also be a difficult time of waiting -- especially for children. Waiting for the day when you can open the gifts that you see under the tree. What can we do to make this time of waiting for Christmas more than just a useless time in the waiting place? Well, we can think about the true meaning of Christmas. We can think about Jesus and his love. We can think about giving instead of receiving. We can enjoy all of beautiful music and the decorations of the season. When we do those things, we will find joy in the waiting place. We are waiting for Christmas, but we are also waiting for something else. We are waiting for Jesus' return. He told us that he would come again and he told us to watch and be ready for him. What should we do while we are waiting? We should worship and praise him, love and serve him, and share his love with others. When we are doing those things, we will be ready for his return, and we will find joy in the waiting place.


