

Dear Friends,

The Covid-19 virus has caused everyone to re-think and re-assess every aspect of their social activities. Among these changes are the various ways that have altered our ability to worship together.

Since the re-opening of our beloved church building in May we have steadfastly complied with safe practices such as hand sanitation, social distancing and wearing masks in light of the rules limiting personal attendance in the Church itself.

Since Christmas is approaching and virus cases continue to rise we feel that now is the best time to describe what Christmas will “look like” at Saint Christine’s Parish.

As Catholics, our desire to come together to worship and celebrate “Emmanuel” [“God Is With Us”] is especially unrelentingly on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

But the Covid-19 virus is unrelenting too and just as there was no “room ... at the inn” for Jesus, Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem [Luke 2:7], the circumstances of this year dictate that there simply will not be sufficient room at the Church to accommodate an overwhelming attendance rush on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

Remember, the dispensation granted by Cardinal Seán from the Sunday Mass obligation remains in effect. Please keep this in mind especially if you are elderly or have a complicating physical/medical condition.

Here are the changes:

In essence, you can choose:

1. To attend Christmas Eve or Morning Mass, (**safely and with mask and with a previous reservation**)
2. To receive Christmas Communion at the Crib outside the church building on Christmas Eve or Morning
3. To participate by viewing a live-stream Christmas Mass from our church on Christmas Eve or Morning

On Christmas Eve, [Thursday, December 24, 2020] there will be Masses at 1:00 pm, 3:00 pm, 5:00 pm, 7:00 pm, and 9:00 pm. As is our practice, Holy Communion will be distributed at the end of Mass.

***** Please note that there will be no 4:00 pm or 6:00 pm Mass on Christmas Eve.**

On Christmas Day, [Friday, December 25, 2020] there will be Mass at 10:00 a.m.

In order to be fair to all, we will use a call in reservation system. This week, Ann will be available to take **reservation on Monday, December 14th and Wednesday, December 16th during the hours of 10:00am and 2:00pm.** Reservations will only be taken at these times this week. Please just call the rectory during those times and speak to Ann with the number of people in your party. We will also need the following information: Your name, phone number, email address (if you have one), number of people including yourself who will be attending, Mass time requested, and if your group will have a stroller and/or wheelchair.

In order to accomplish the welcome and seating for Christmas, we are in need of volunteers. If you are able to help, please contact Ann at the rectory as well. We will be having a meeting with those willing to volunteer before Christmas.

The second choice allows people to come to see the Infant in the Outside Crib and receive Christmas Communion without having to enter the building space. Fr. Brian and/or I will make ourselves available by the outside Crib at 2:00 pm, 4:00 pm, 6:00 pm 8:00 pm on Christmas Eve. On Christmas Day, I will be there at 9:00 am and 11:00am

Each Mass will be shown “live” on the Parish Facebook page. In addition the 1:00 pm Mass on Christmas Eve will be re-broadcast on Christmas Day on local cable.

Please recall that as Catholics we celebrate “Christmas” on more than a day - it is a liturgical season that begins with the Vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on January 10, 2021. This brings us many opportunities to attend Mass to celebrate “Emmanuel” [God is With Us]

Sadly, as has been the case since the virus began, there will not be any choir at any of the Masses.

The door to the Church will be open 30 minutes before each Mass and we respectfully request that all attendees leave the church promptly and safely after receiving the Eucharist.

Please consider these factors as Christmas approaches and make appropriate decisions to insure the health of your personal families and our parish family as well.

Christmas blessings to the many volunteers who have made worship possible by staying after each Mass or service to disinfect the church. Without their great generosity the doors of our church would be closed.

May the grace and wisdom of the Child born in Bethlehem be upon you and your families this Christmas Season.

Reading

IS 61:1-2A, 10-11

Isaiah announces a jubilee year! As we prepare for the coming of Our Lord what are you bringing to this jubilee year? Do you accept your role in salvation?

The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners, to announce a year of favor from the LORD and a day of vindication by our God. I rejoice heartily in the LORD, in my God is the joy of my soul; for he has clothed me with a robe of salvation and wrapped me in a mantle of justice, like a bridegroom adorned with a diadem, like a bride bedecked with her jewels. As the earth brings forth its plants, and a garden makes its growth spring up, so will the Lord GOD make justice and praise spring up before all the nations.

Paul gives us direction after we have accepted the gifts of God. He wants us to "test everything; retain what is good. Refrain from every kind of evil." How does God of peace make you perfectly holy? We are washed from sin with his holy blood shed on the cross. Again, do accept this gift from Him!

Brothers and sisters:

Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophetic utterances.

Test everything; retain what is good. Refrain from every kind of evil. May the God of peace make you perfectly holy and may you entirely, spirit, soul, and body, be preserved blameless for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will also accomplish it.

Gospel

JN 1:6-8, 19-28

Do you know who this man John is? Of course, it's John the Baptist, who was sent to lead the way of Jesus. Some thought he was the Messiah, but he set them straight. Re-read the last part of the reading to see why God sent him.

A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. And this is the testimony of John. When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?" He admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Christ." So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" He said: "I am *the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord,'*" as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." This happened in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

Some Thoughts...Our Bible reading for today tells us that God sent a man, John the Baptist, to tell about the light so that everyone would believe. John wasn't the light, he only came to tell others about the light. Who was the light that John came to tell people about? That's right, it was Jesus. The one true light, who gives light to everyone.

There is a song that tells about that light, "The Light of the World Is Jesus."

The whole world was lost in the darkness
of sin,
The Light of the world is Jesus;
Like sunshine at noonday,
His glory shone in,
The Light of the world is Jesus!


Come to the Light, 'tis shining for thee;
Sweetly the Light has dawned upon me.

At this time of year, we see lights everywhere that remind us of the coming of that true Light that John told us about. There are trees adorned with lights, streets that are lined with lights, homes and businesses are outlined with lights. One of the favorite activities of the season is to drive around and look at all of the beautiful lights. Each Sunday of the Advent season, we light candles on the Advent wreath.

I wonder how many of us remember that the lights of this season are a symbol of the one true Light, Jesus, who brought light into the darkness of this world? As we light the candles on our advent wreath, the four candles remind us that Jesus brings hope, love, joy, and peace into the world. It is true, "The whole world was lost in the darkness of sin, the Light of the world is Jesus!" Let us pray. Our Father, on this third Sunday of Advent, we light the candle that symbolizes the joy that Jesus brings. May each and every one of us know the joy that Jesus, the Light of the World, brings. In his name we pray. Amen.


