

MOTHER'S DAY

The woman who fears the Lord is to be praised. ~Proverbs 31:30b



May 9, 2021

Dear Friends,

This first week of May brought about a practice employed both in hours of celebration and crisis over the last four centuries. Our nation's bishops re-consecrated these shores to Our Lady, this time as "Mother of the Church" – a title declared by St Paul VI at the close of Vatican II and reemphasized by the reigning Pope, who gave Mary a universal feast on the Monday after Pentecost.

Seeing this happen, realizing as we celebrate this Mother's Day, it got me thinking there has got to be a better way to honor mothers without alienating those who don't fit into a tidy box. What I have come to understand is that Mother's Day can have complexities and nuances far beyond the binary approach to motherhood. Either you are or you aren't a mother doesn't begin to capture it. We can and need to create space for fuller truth.

We begin with most famous mother in history. I believe that by far the most famous mother in history belongs to the most famous person in history, Jesus Christ. His mother's name, of course, was Mary. What do we know about this extraordinary mother? We know that Mary was conceived by the Holy Spirit according to the Word of God, that she gave birth to Jesus in a stable, that she brought Him up and had a part in His ministry, and she was there at the foot of the cross when Jesus called to John, His apostle, and said, "Son behold your mother, mother behold your son". She was present at Jesus' resurrection and was in the upper room on the day of Pentecost when the Spirit fell as tongues of fire on the believers.

The most beautiful was the relationship a mother shared with her son. In the movie, "The Passion of the Christ", one of the most touching moments came when Christ fell under the weight of His cross and Mary ran to His side. She lifted up His bloody face and remembered a part of His childhood. Though this scene is not found in scripture, it did remind us of a part of Christ's life we often do not regard much – the relationship He shared with His mother. Mary knew Jesus, probably better than anyone else. Remember He was thirty years old when His ministry began, and up until this time He was a carpenter like His earthly father, Joseph. He had spent thirty years in an earthly family. Anyone who shares a good relationship with his or her mother knows that when you become an adult, the relationship is like a friendship. Mary was not only Jesus' mother, but was also His friend.

Mary allows us to go beyond the surface of mothering, asking for forgiveness when we assume that what we see on the surface is all there is to our story. We know in our midst there are women and mothers who like Mary, have tasted the bitterness of a child's death, like Mary, have been separated from your child at a young age, like Mary, have a complicated pregnancy story or like Mary, have children with public legal situations and all you can do is watch.

With Mary, we join and pray for all those around us whose hearts are breaking for what they lost or never had. Mary, our mother, who lost her only Son, is close to them in their grief. With Mary we join together with the unnamed women who never quite fit into the norms of society. We join with the mother, who reluctantly gave up her child because it wasn't safe for her to bring her child up herself, or the women who were called to love and nurture children that weren't theirs by birth. We join with women either never marrying or not having children. We join with those who have lost their babies. We celebrate all that captures the gamut of Motherhood, loving another and all that makes our 'mothering' come out. We thank God for you for all are in our midst.

It's a day to celebrate moms and the impact that they have on our lives. I had a great mom. She had the spiritual gift of mercy and was full of compassion. She got to exercise those gifts all the time when she was raising me. For those of you who haven't met my mother, her name was Dorothy, meaning a gift from God.

I have three older brothers and one younger sister. If you've ever met my family then you'll see right away just how different we all are. I think those differences serve as a tribute to how well my parents raised us. There's a passage in Proverbs 22 that reads, "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." (Proverbs 22:6) Scholars say the word translated "way he should go" means a child's natural bent. In other words, it's up to the parent to be with their child, see the way in which they are wired and help facilitate the growth of those natural strengths and areas of giftedness. My parents did a good job of that. They didn't try to squeeze us into some predetermined mold. They didn't force us. They let us grow into the men and woman we were naturally to become. Parents have a two-fold task of promoting and encouraging the image of God in their children based on how they are while at the same time restraining and correcting areas in which God's ways may be understood in a younger mind. Talk about a roller coaster! That's why kids can drive one crazy at one moment and in the very next they make one want cry tears of joy. I'm thinking that this is even more true under the conditions that the spread of COVID-19 has caused.

Even with that dynamic going on in our home, my parents did a good job of pointing us to Christ and showing us our need for a savior. They promoted and encouraged who we were to become even when our unique personality profiles might have driven them crazy. My mother, with her gift of mercy and compassion, was especially patient and understanding in even my worst moments. Every child grows up, eventually. One night I remember I called my parents and told them how thankful I was for their patience in raising me. I can remember during my "rebellious years" that I caused my mother to cry more than a few tears.

She always took the path of compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, patience, forgiveness and love. My mom always promoted and encouraged the image of God where she saw it in me.

We are all called to be a people who promote and encourage the image of God where we see it. Today we are called to see it in the women in our midst who do motherly things for all of us. We are called to be a people who rejoice with those who rejoice and mourn with those who mourn. For the seen and known joys of motherhood, we rejoice and smile and celebrate with you. For the seen and known suffering in motherhood, we ache with you. For the private unseen and unknown joys of motherhood, like Mary, may you treasure them in your hearts. And for the private unseen and unknown sorrows and suffering of motherhood, may you know you don't always have to be happy in our midst. You are engraved on the palms of God, both the seen and unseen, held together by Him. I leave you all with these final thoughts:

To those who gave birth this year to their first child - we celebrate with you

To those who lost a child this year – we mourn with you

To those who are in the trenches with little ones every day and wear the badge of food stains – we appreciate you

To those who experienced loss through miscarriage, failed adoptions, or running away - we mourn with you

To those who walk the hard path of infertility, fraught with pokes, prods, tears, and disappointment – we walk with you. Forgive us when we say foolish things. We don't mean to make this harder than it is.

To those who are foster moms, mentor moms, and spiritual moms – we need you

To those who have warm and close relationships with your children – we celebrate with you

To those who have disappointment, heartache, and distance with your children – we sit with you

To those who lost their mothers this year – we grieve with you

To those who experienced abuse at the hands of your own mother – we acknowledge your experience

To those who lived through driving tests, medical tests, and the overall testing of motherhood – we are better for having you in our midst

To those who have aborted children – we remember them and you on this day

To those who are single and long to be married and mothering your own children – we mourn that life has not turned out the way you longed for it to be

To those who step-parent – we walk with you on these complex paths

To those who envisioned lavishing love on grandchildren - yet that dream is not to be, we grieve with you

To those who will have emptier nests in the upcoming year – we grieve and rejoice with you

To those who placed children up for adoption — we commend you for your selflessness and remember how you hold that child in your heart.

And to those who are pregnant with new life, both expected and surprising – we anticipate with you.

This Mother's Day, we walk with you. Mothering is not for the faint of heart and we have real warriors in our midst. We remember you and we love you.

**SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER
MAY 9, 2021**

Reading Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

As Peter states, we should not revere human beings, only God. This scene shows us that all, not just the Jews, who believe can receive the Holy Spirit. Who are the circumcised, the answer might surprise you? When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and, falling at his feet, paid him homage. Peter, however, raised him up, saying, "Get up. I myself am also a human being." Then Peter proceeded to speak and said, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality. Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him." While Peter was still speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. The circumcised believers who had accompanied Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit should have been poured out on the Gentiles also, for they could hear them speaking in tongues and glorifying God. Then Peter responded, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?" He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus

Reading 1 Jn 4:7-10

Twice in this reading we find "God is love". Although we do love God, it is only His love for us that He sent Jesus to us. Why did He do this?

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God; everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love.

In this way the love of God was revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might have life through him. In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins.

Gospel Jn 15:9-17

This scene with His disciples is one of the greatest. Jesus makes us all equals and gives us again the second of His two commandments, "love one another as I love you". What is the first?

Jesus said to his disciples:

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you.

Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love.


"I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing.

I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you.

This I command you: love one another."

Some Thoughts: This week's discussion is about cookies, very special ones—the recipe was used for many years by a special lady named Lottie Moon. Lottie Moon lived many years ago. She grew up in a Christian home and went to church and learned about Jesus and his love for all of us.

Lottie had six brothers and sisters. One of her sisters was a missionary in China. Reading the letters her sister wrote helped Lottie to come to love the Chinese people and decide that she also wanted to be a missionary to China. Lottie went to college and studied to become a teacher then went to help her sister teach the children of China. When she arrived in China, Lottie started a school and began to hold classes to teach boys and girls to read the Bible. At first, the Chinese children were afraid of Lottie. She tried to think of a way to get the children to trust her. She decided to bake some cookies, but that didn't work. You see, the children were afraid to eat the cookies because they were afraid that they might have poison in them. One day, one of the boys was so hungry that he decided to try one of the cookies. When he didn't get sick, the other children decided to try them too. Soon, Lottie became known as "the cookie lady." After the children ate the cookies, they would talk with Lottie, hear Bible stories and learn to read. Why do you think Lottie loved the Chinese children so much? I think it was because she believed and put into practice what Jesus taught his disciples. Jesus said, "Love one another as I have loved you." How much did Jesus love us? He loved us so much that he gave his life for us. Lottie loved the children of China so much that she dedicated her life to teaching them how to read and write. And, even more important, she taught them about Jesus and his love. He loves you too — and he wants you to love others as he loved you. How can you show the love of Jesus to other people? Maybe you could bake cookies for a someone who is sad or lonely. Maybe you could be a friend to a new student at school who doesn't know anyone. You could go to visit and pray for someone who is sick. There are a lot of ways to show people that you love them. God wants all of us to be missionaries — like Lottie Moon — but you don't have to go to China to be a missionary. You can be a missionary right where you live! In fact, I think that is what God wants us to do.

Me: Happy Day to you!

God: Ah, my good friend. And a happy day to you as well

Me: OK, I have to be honest with you. I'm not exactly thrilled today.

God: And why is that?

Me: Well, I loved the message the readings sent today, but wow, that 'love one another part' is *so* difficult sometimes - a lot of times.

God: Yes, I knew that was a real challenge for you all. But answer this: why not?

Me: Why not? Well, a lot of people do some really nasty things, and some people, even in our own families, are just not that easy to get along with. They don't deserve to be treated all that well.

God: And so you treat them how? With anger or resentment, which only makes things worse, right?

Me: Yeah, but it's hard.

God: And I agree with you. But by loving them, treating them with kindness, there's a chance that things could get better between the two of you. But with anger and resentment? No chance at all.

Me: So turn the other cheek

God: So many of you misinterpret that message. I'm not saying to just sit there and be someone's punching bag. But by turning one's cheek, you are setting an example for others to follow. If it doesn't work, I also taught to leave, brush the dust off your feet and move on.

Me: I forgot about that.

God: Yes, you all often do. And please remember this - when you are leaving someone because turning the other cheek hasn't worked out so well, pray for them. Not for them to love you necessarily, but simply pray *for* them. Is that so hard?

Me: Well, sometimes it doesn't feel that easy, but I understand that is what we should do for each other.

God: And there's the love I was talking about. Bake some cookies! Make some soup! Send a nice card - and you don't have to sign it! That gets them every time.


