


Dear Friends,

This weekend, we celebrate Memorial Day with the great honor of remembering those women and men of our small towns, cities, state, and country who fought in the great wars. It is a very special weekend in that it honors the nation's armed services personnel killed in wartime, and reminds us all of the sacrifices made by those who have served or are serving our country.

This holiday was originally called Decoration Day because it is a time for decorating graves with flowers and flags. Over time, the designation Memorial Day became much more popular.

To give us a little background, many local observances to honor the war dead in the United States became widespread following the American Civil War (1861-1865), which had taken close to a million lives. In 1868, General Logan, of a Union veteran's group, issued an order to designate May 30th as a day for "strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion (Civil War), and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village, and hamlet churchyard in the land." After World War I (1914-1918), Memorial Day observances were changed to honor the dead in all American wars, starting with the American Revolution. The U.S. Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday in 1971, and changed the date of observance from May 30th to the last Monday in May to give workers a three-day weekend.

Memorial Day, as we know, is marked by parades, speeches, and the decoration of graves. Traditionally, the president or vice president places a wreath on the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington National Cemetery, and small flags are placed on all the graves. Many people choose to visit family graves on Memorial Day.

Let us give thanks to God many times this weekend and throughout the year for such brave and unselfish soldiers!

Please pray for the souls of the faithful departed. Pray for peace that only the Lord can bring. Pray for the survivors, who mourn the death of their loved ones. Pray for innocent civilians. Pray for the enemy.

Let us remember that many soldiers paid an incredible price of giving their lives that we might live in freedom, especially religious freedom. We were able to celebrate Easter, the Ascension of the Lord, and can look forward to Pentecost precisely because these women and men were willing to sacrifice their lives for the many freedoms we enjoy.



Reading

Dt 4:32-34, 39-40

Moses is recalling some of the great things that God has done for His people. Although Moses is addressing the Israelites, how does this apply to us?

Moses said to the people:

"Ask now of the days of old, before your time, ever since God created man upon the earth; ask from one end of the sky to the other: Did anything so great ever happen before? Was it ever heard of? Did a people ever hear the voice of God speaking from the midst of fire, as you did, and live? Or did any god venture to go and take a nation for himself from the midst of another nation, by testings, by signs and wonders, by war, with strong hand and outstretched arm, and by great terrors, all of which the LORD, your God, did for you in Egypt before your very eyes? This is why you must now know, and fix in your heart, that the LORD is God in the heavens above and on earth below, and that there is no other. You must keep his statutes and commandments that I enjoin on you today, that you and your children after you may prosper, and that you may have long life on the land which the LORD, your God, is giving you forever."

Reading

Rom 8:14-17

We all have gifts given by the Holy Spirit, mine different from yours, but all for the glory of God. These gifts are for us all, Jew or Gentile, only for the asking. What are your gifts; do you use them for the Lord?

Brothers and sisters:

No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit.

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone.

To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.

As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ.

For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.

Alleluia, alleluia.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Gospel

Mt 28:16-20

Before Jesus ascends He tells His followers that the Spirit will be with them? And also with us! But here, He gives them AND us a mission 'Testify to the truth!' The Spirit testifies to the Truth, and we, also, are to testify to the Truth. What comes from the Father, through Jesus and the Spirit to us is the incredible and awesome love all three have for us! How do or should we respond?

Jesus said to his disciples:

"When the Advocate comes whom I will send you from the Father, the Spirit of truth that proceeds from the Father, he will testify to me.

And you also testify, because you have been with me from the beginning.

"I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming. He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you. Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you."

Some Thoughts: Suppose that you wanted to tell your best friend about God's love. What would you say? Everything you need to know about God's love is in the Bible. You could take your Bible and go to your friend's house and read about God's love from the Bible. Let's see, what should you read? The Bible is divided into the Old Testament and the New Testament, sixty-six books, 1189 chapters, and 31,173 verses. That is a little bit scary isn't it? It would be easy for you to get lost and confused. What if we could shrink the message of God's love down so small that it could fit inside this nutshell? That would be great, wouldn't it? Well, I think we can do that this morning.

I did a search on my computer for the top 10 verses in the Bible. I searched for the top ten verses that people know, love, and read the most often. Can you guess what the number one verse is? John 3:16! How many of you can say that verse with me? "For God so loved the world that he have his only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." That is good news, isn't it? That is everything you need to know about God's love. Now let's take a closer look at what this verse tells us.

Who is this verse about? - God

What does God do? - loves

Who & what does God love? - the world, creation, and each of us

What did God do to show his love? - gave his one and only Son, Jesus

What must we do in return? - believe that Jesus is the Son of God, and repent from our sins

What is our reward? - eternal life with God in heaven

The Spirit touches each of us differently! How have you been touched? And yes, you have been touched! Talk to the Spirit about it.

Me: Nice day, isn't it?

God: Yes it is. I think we should have a cook-out this evening.

Me: Great idea. I'll be glad to do the grilling if you would like.

God: Ah, someone after my heart. Thank you my friend.

Me: You are welcome. Now, can I ask you a question?

God: Fire away. I love our prayer time together, and there is nothing better than a question to get us going.

Me: Right. So there is doubt and confusion in the Gospel today. And in the latest episode of *The Chosen*, there was also a lot of it. On the part of the apostles trying to figure out just what your plan was, and on the part of the Pharisees trying to figure out what to do about you. Why so much doubt and confusion?

God: Do you think you would have been able to figure out all that was going on?

Me: Probably not, but I thought these people were so learned and all

God: They had no clue! Their beliefs were being challenged. Their religious practices were being upset. Their way of life was being turned upside down. Anyone would be confused, doubtful, sort of angry, and certainly insecure in that situation, wouldn't you agree?

Me: Oh absolutely. I guess I just keep forgetting that they were humans just like us. We know them as saints and such, you know?

God: Yes, I get that. I know them as saints too. But before they were saints, they were humans who were frightened, confused, doubtful...all of that and more.

Me: Makes me think I have it pretty good, all things considered.

God: And you do. Everyone has difficult times in their life. It might be personal, family, physical, financial, emotional, what have you, and no one just cruises along without any doubts or fears.

Me: So I know I've asked this in the past, but it's okay then to be a little scattered and distracted.

God: Well, yes it is - but don't make it a habit, okay? You don't want to hear my power voice!

Me: I'm sorry Lord. Didn't mean...

God: Relax please! You know how I love to share a laugh with you when we pray. Now, what's on tonight's grill? Burgers? chicken? and maybe we could do some S'Mores by the fire pit? I love S'Mores.


