



Dear Friends,

With the first heat wave gone by, summertime is upon us – a time for sipping lemonade and enjoying the outdoors. The summer season is a time for travel, baseball, and sunscreen. As Saint Christine's Parish moves into the summer season, I want to invite you to continue to pray for the process of pastoral planning in which we are engaged with the Archdiocese.

God is already at work shaping us and equipping us to minister to the needs of our community. There has been some wonderful interest in the women's group. The present men's group is excitedly and aggressively looking and engaging new members. Perhaps you might be interested in one of these groups. Another group of parishioners is working to engage us in some fun activities while raising much needed funds for the parish. I am also greatly looking forward to working with the social committee to be able to enjoy some wonderful family events. Even in the summer months, our religious education directors are busy planning for a fun, educational and spiritual year. I know we have a long history of doing such ministry, and I sense God is leading us to claim a rich future of sharing God's amazing grace and love.

As June ends, we move to our summer schedule, which means in July and August, Masses will be at 5:00 pm on Saturday, 7:00 am and 11:00 am on Sunday in the Main Church. Also on Sunday morning at the Chapel, there will be Masses at 8:00 am and 9:30 am. Even with a shortage of priests, you can be assured of these two Masses all summer until Labor day. Please note the slight time adjustment for this year. As I make some plans for time away myself, I might have to adjust some of the daily morning Masses in July or August. During the summer, there is no 9:00 am Mass at the Main Church on Sundays. Please remember that the parish does keep going throughout the summer.

Anything we can do for you, just call. A fall in revenue usually occurs as people go to churches in other areas. While it is good to be generous to your 'vacation parishes', we also continue to need your support throughout the summer. If you are going away, consider placing your envelopes for the weeks you will be away in the collection basket either before

you leave or when you come back. Online Giving is a wonderful way to continue to support the parish.

Slowly, we need to get back to the \$9,000 - \$10,000 range for our weekly revenue. This will allow us to keep up with our daily expenses and have some in reserve for necessary projects. Please remember every week, there are two collections at the Chapel. As you know in your own home, the bills keep mounting. Please keep up your usual generosity during the coming summer months. For us, it is of great importance. Thanks for helping us and have a good time planning and living your summer!



**Reading EZ 17:22-24**

*This is a metaphor for the coming of Christ. From the line of David will come the Messiah. Do you find hope in the “tender shoot” of cedar?*

Thus says the Lord GOD:

I, too, will take from the crest of the cedar, from its topmost branches tear off a tender shoot, and plant it on a high and lofty mountain; on the mountain heights of Israel I will plant it. It shall put forth branches and bear fruit, and become a majestic cedar. Birds of every kind shall dwell beneath it, every winged thing in the shade of its boughs. And all the trees of the field shall know that I, the LORD, bring low the high tree, lift high the lowly tree, wither up the green tree, and make the withered tree bloom. As I, the LORD, have spoken, so will I do.

**Reading**

**2 COR 5:6-10**

*Paul wrote to give courage to the Corinthians to during trying times. Our hope is not in the world, but in the judgment of the Lord. Do you have faith that you “may receive recompense”? How?*

Brothers and sisters:

We are always courageous, although we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight.

Yet we are courageous, and we would rather leave the body and go home to the Lord.

Therefore, we aspire to please him, whether we are at home or away. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense, according to what he did in the body, whether good or evil.

**Gospel**

**Mk 4:26-34**

*As the sower does not know how a seed germinates, we do not know how the seed of faith germinates in our hearts. What must be done to plant that seed?*

Jesus said to the crowds:

“This is how it is with the kingdom of God;

it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come.”\

He said, “To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it?”

It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade.”

With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

**Some Thoughts:** Do you like apples? Today I am going to tell you the story of a man called Johnny Appleseed. As you might guess, Johnny Appleseed was not his real name. His real name was John Chapman. He was born in 1774 in the state of Massachusetts. When he was in his early twenties, John became a nurseryman. A nurseryman is someone who works with plants, trees, and shrubs. John Chapman especially loved apple trees and he planted them all around the town where he lived. But that wasn't enough for John, He wanted people everywhere to enjoy apples just as much as he did, so he traveled all around the country planting apple trees and giving away apple seeds.

John Chapman was a simple man. He traveled all around the country on foot, usually without shoes. He often wore a shirt which he made from a seed sack with holes cut in it for his head and arms. He had a beard and wore a tin cooking pot as a hat. In fact, he often took the tin pot off of his head and used it to cook his supper. John Chapman was a kind and gentle man who was liked by everyone he met. He became well known and people began to call him Johnny Appleseed. Johnny Appleseed's life wasn't easy, but he loved what he was doing. He never married, but he had more friends than he could count. He lived a long and happy life enjoying the great outdoors and the beauty of God's creation until God called him home in March of 1845.

You may be asking, "What does the story of Johnny Appleseed have to do with our Bible lesson for today?" Well, the story of Johnny Appleseed is a bit like the parable that Jesus told in our Bible reading for today. Jesus said, "The kingdom of God is like a man who scatters seed on the ground. Night and day, whether he is asleep or awake, the seed sprouts and grows, but the man doesn't know how it happens."

Just as Johnny Appleseed was passionate about planting apple seeds, God wants you and me to be passionate about planting seeds of the Good News everywhere we go. If we will take the Good News of Jesus to people, it will take root in their life and begin to grow. We may not understand it, but that is the way the kingdom of God grows -- by people like you and me planting the seed and watching it grow.

*The Spirit touches each of us differently! How have you been touched? And yes, you have been touched! Talk to the Spirit about it.*

**God:** Good morning my friend. How are you today?

**Me:** Actually, not good. Sort of angry to be honest.

**God:** Oh no. What seems to be the problem?

**Me:** Well, first of all, I've had some problems in my family. Some terrible sickness, and then there's a divorce sort of happening

**God:** Not good, eh?

**Me:** Well no, of course not. And then I get to the point where I'm angry at you! How do you let these things happen!?

**God:** They happen in human life.

**Me:** That's not a good enough answer for me.

**YOU'RE SUPPOSED TO FIX ALL THIS SO THAT IT DOESN'T HAPPEN!!**

**God:** I'm sorry, but it does happen.

**Me:** C'mon please. You're God, you can fix this.

**God:** How?

**Me:** I DON'T KNOW!! YOU'RE GOD, NOT ME!!!

**God:** OK, so let's work through this

**Me:** No! Sometimes I just need to get it off my chest, and you have to listen.

**God:** Well, yes I do. That is part of what I am here for.

**Me:** Excuse me?

**God:** Look, I never promised paradise here - that comes in my Kingdom, not this one. But I did promise that you could yell at me, that you could count on me listening. It's loud prayer, but it *is* prayer.

**Me:** Well I'm not so sure it counts as prayer but...

**God:** Did you ever read that book by Mitch Albom where a rabbi says he feels sorry for atheists because they have no one to be angry at? This is what he was talking about. You can be angry at me. Nail all this stuff to my cross! I can take it. You may not be able to handle it, so give it to me.

**Me:** ...I never thought of you in this way. I thought it was a sin to be angry at you.

**God:** Well, it's not pleasant, but it happens because you are human. Just be honest with me when you are angry or hurt.

**Me:** And right now, I don't feel so angry

**God:** See? That's why it's okay to get it out, even if it's loud and angry. C'mon, let's go get some ice cream and we can talk some more - or maybe just watch the sunset.
