

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, With Black Catholic History month coming up, I would like to share some reflections on important figures of Black Catholic culture. I hope this will be a helpful way for all of us to grow in appreciation of the richness and value of the African-American experience in the Church.

In the 1946 issue of Ebony Magazine, an essay was published by the great Harlem Renaissance poet and novelist Claude McKay: "Why I Became A Catholic". (I've included it as an insert in this week's bulletin.) Claude McKay was born in Jamaica in 1890, and moved to Harlem in 1915 to join the growing literary movement there. With the publication of his book of poetry *Harlem Shadows* in 1921, he became famous as one of the brightest talents in Black culture. Many of his early poems are well known, perhaps best of all, "If We Must Die":

If we must die, let it not be like hogs Hunted and penned in an inglorious spot... Like men we'll face the murderous, cowardly pack,

Pressed to the wall, dying, but fighting back!

Rejecting the Protestant religion of his youth, McKay blamed Christianity for many of the problems Blacks were experiencing, judging it a tool of oppressive white capitalists. McKay was an early follower of Communism, but soon became disillusioned with its politics, finding it closeminded and inhuman. After living abroad in Europe, Africa, and Asia, he became attracted to the Catholic Church through her art and architecture. McKay moved back to Harlem, and soon became friends with a number of prominent Black Catholics there.

After moving to Chicago in order to apply himself to various causes of social justice, he became convinced of the truth of the Catholic faith, and was baptized on October 11th, 1944. Many biographers have noted McKay's lifelong spirit of independence, refusal to compromise, and commitment to honesty, as well as his steadfast opposition to racism in all its forms. For him, entering the Church was like coming home after a long life of journeying abroad, a final door that made sense of all the passions and commitments of his life.

McKay believed that only Catholicism possessed the "secret" that could resolve the social problems he had spent so long fighting: "the positive way of life preached by Jesus Christ," transcending all divisions of race and nation: "Some modernists may say that joining the Catholic Church is a backward step. But to me it is the progressive step, which should have been taken long ago.... I contemplate the Catholic Church as a vast world organization of human brotherhood, preaching the Word of the Lord Jesus Christ, crucified and risen."

His life was cut short by heart disease in May of 1948, but not without leaving a number of new "Catholic" poems. In one, "Truth," he reflects on that grace of finally coming home:

I found it not in years of Unbelief In science stirring life like budding trees, In Revolution like a dazzling thief. Oh, shall I find it on my bended knees? In this vast world of lies and hate and greed,

Upon my knees, Oh Lord, for Truth I plead. God bless you, Fr Matt
