

## **DECEMBER 26TH, 2021—THE HOLY FAMILY**

### **From the Pastor's Desk**

#### **A Blessed Christmas to you all!**

Christmas Greetings to all of you my brothers and sisters in Jesus! I pray to God that you are all enjoying a wonderful Feast on this very special day that commemorates the birth of the Infant Jesus. For today is a time of great joy for all the nations throughout the world.

In the first reading (Is. 52:7-10) Prophet Isaiah proclaimed to the people of Israel that God was coming into the world through the person of Jesus. The second reading from the letter to the Hebrews reminds us that God spoke to the people in many and various ways by the prophets, but, when Baby Jesus was born, things changed. Now, God was going to speak to us through His beloved Son.

In today's Gospel saint John tells us who is Jesus and why he came into the world. Jesus is God incarnated. He is the Word of God. He was with God in the beginning and He is God. All things were created through Him. Nothing that exists had its existence without Jesus. What has come into the world through Jesus who is the giver of life is eternal life, Jesus came as the Light of all people, answering the hope of all by showing the way to eternal life, joy and peace.

The opening chapter of the book of prophet Isaiah says,

*An ox knows its owner  
and an ass, its master's manger,  
But Israel does not know  
my people has not understood (Isa 1:3)*

Seven centuries later when God became one of us in Bethlehem many people did not know Him. What more could God have done for us? This Christmas is another chance for us to get to know Jesus, the Son of God, be filled with joy and peace.

#### **The feast of the Holy Family**

This Sunday, we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family (December 26). All of us, but especially the children, should read the third chapter of the book of Sirach that gives us a picture of a Jewish family in the Old Testament. We discover how respect, love and obedience for parents were inculcated in the hearts of Jewish children. Our parents may not be perfect, but we should be grateful that they gave us life, loved us, and took care of us. They take God's place in our lives!

The importance of the family cannot be overemphasized. It is in the family where we learn our values, spiritual and material. It is the place where as children, we first learn about God and how to pray. There seems, however, to be a lot of in broken families in today's society. Many families have experienced the pain of divorce with shared parenting: weekends in one home and weekdays in another. This long and scary list of wounds may be a heavy baggage which adult children from broken marriages and families carry to their own marriages.

The Feast of the Holy Family is a celebration of God's call to be a **Holy family**. No matter how wounded the family may be, healing and holiness are always possible. We should hold on to this hope. Thus, this Christmas, let us pray harder for our families and for those who are struggling in their marriages. I urge you to pray together as a family because "**The family that prays together stays together.**"

I wish you all a happy and a healthy New Year 2022.

¡Saludos navideños a todos ustedes, mis hermanos y hermanas en Jesús! Ruego a Dios que todos estén disfrutando de una maravillosa Fiesta en este día tan especial que conmemora el nacimiento del Niño Jesús. Porque hoy es un momento de gran alegría para todas las naciones del mundo.

En la primera lectura (Isaías 52: 7-10), el profeta Isaías proclamó al pueblo de Israel que Dios vendría al mundo a través de la persona de Jesús. La segunda lectura de la carta a los Hebreos nos recuerda que Dios habló a la gente de muchas y diversas formas por medio de los profetas, pero, cuando nació el Niño Jesús, las cosas cambiaron. Ahora, Dios nos iba a hablar a través de Su amado Hijo.

En el evangelio de hoy, san Juan nos dice quién es Jesús y por qué vino al mundo. Jesús es Dios encarnado. El es la Palabra de Dios. Él estaba con Dios en el principio y es Dios. Todas las cosas fueron creadas por medio de él. Nada de lo que existe tuvo su existencia sin Jesús. Lo que ha venido al mundo a través de Jesús, que es el dador de vida, es vida eterna. El capítulo inicial del libro del profeta Isaías dice:

Siete siglos después, cuando Dios se convirtió en uno de nosotros en Belén, mucha gente no lo conocía. ¿Qué más podría haber hecho Dios por nosotros? Esta Navidad es otra oportunidad para que podamos conocer a Jesús, el Hijo de Dios, llenarnos de gozo y paz.

**La fiesta de la Sagrada Familia**

Este domingo celebramos la fiesta de la Sagrada Familia (26 de diciembre). Todos nosotros, pero especialmente los niños, deberíamos leer el tercer capítulo del libro de Eclesiástico que nos da una imagen de una familia judía en el Antiguo Testamento. Descubrimos cómo se inculcó el respeto, el amor y la obediencia a los padres en el corazón de los niños judíos. Puede que nuestros padres no sean perfectos, pero debemos estar agradecidos de que nos hayan dado la vida, nos hayan amado y nos hayan cuidado. ¡Ocupan el lugar de Dios en nuestras vidas!

No se puede exagerar la importancia de la familia. Es en la familia donde aprendemos nuestros valores, espirituales y materiales. Es el lugar donde, de niños, aprendemos por primera vez sobre Dios y cómo orar. Sin embargo, parece haber muchas familias rotas en la sociedad actual. Muchas familias han experimentado el dolor del divorcio con la paternidad compartida: los fines de semana en una casa y los días de semana en otra. Esta larga y aterradora lista de heridas puede ser un pesado bagaje que los hijos adultos de matrimonios y familias rotas llevan a sus propios matrimonios.


