Wise Men...Hmmm!

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. Epiphany means manifestation or glorious appearance. Jesus has come and is the light of the world, a light that is meant to be shared and not kept hidden. So, how are we doing with that? Has the “proverbial light bulb” gone off for us? Do we really get the message and understand our role? Are we finally becoming “wise people?” Today’s first reading from Isaiah was written after the Jewish people had been released from captivity in Babylon. It describes the glory of Jerusalem which was to be rebuilt by the returning captives. The glory of Jerusalem is to be for Gentiles (pagans) as well as for Jews. All nations are called to share in the light of God.

St. Paul was a rabbi, a Pharisee of Pharisees. It was very hard for Paul to realize how any non-Jew (or Gentile) could share in the blessings promised by God to his Chosen People through Abraham. In his writings, Paul constantly marvels at the “mystery” of God’s love which embrace Jew and Gentile and which reconciles all people in Christ Jesus. Today’s gospel is the story of the Magi or Wise Men who came to find the newborn King. The Magi were Gentile or pagans. The lesson for us is to remember and also live our lives to reflect the fact that all people are called to share in the light of Christ.

So, as we begin this New Year 2021 and thankfully say, “Arrivederci or Adios” to 2020, let’s challenge ourselves to be wise men and women. Let’s share the good news and journey with eyes searching for the light, to see the truth, to see the love, and to see the goodness wherever it may be found. Let this be the year we step out of our comfort zone and share the “Good News” of Jesus with others.

WHAT THE CARES ACT MEANS FOR CHARITABLE GIVING

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act creates two temporary changes to the tax treatment of such donations. One is a universal deduction targeted primarily at the 90+% of standard deduction taxpayers, and the other is meant to incentivize the remaining high-income givers and corporations.

\$300

Universal Deduction
for Donations Up to
\$300

For the 9 out of 10 people who no longer itemize their charitable giving, the CARES Act will allow these individual taxpayers to deduct donations to charity of up to \$300 on their 2020 federal tax return, even though they take the standard deduction.

60%

For those donors who are still able to itemize their deductions, and therefore directly write off gifts to charity, the current deduction cap is 60% of adjusted gross income. Corporations are able to deduct charitable donations up to 10% of taxable income.

*The 60% of AGI limit is for giving to 501(c)(3) public charities. The deductibility of gifts to 501(c)(3) private foundations is capped at 30%, and was not included in this legislation.

WHAT ABOUT THE IRA QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD)?

The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

However, remember that under the CARES Act an individual can elect to deduct 100 percent of their AGI for cash charitable contributions. This effectively affords individuals over 59½ years old the benefits similar to a QCD; they can take a cash distribution from their IRA, contribute the cash to charity, and may completely offset tax attributable to the distribution by taking a charitable deduction in an amount up to 100 percent of their AGI for the tax year.

YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

Yesterday, on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, Pope Francis promulgated a **Year of Saint Joseph** to commemorate the 150th Anniversary of Pope Pius IX's placing the Universal Church under the patronage of Saint Joseph. In his apostolic letter, *Patris Corde*, the Holy Father identifies the many reasons why we would all do well to reflect on the life of Saint Joseph – especially during the coming year. The Pope's letter concludes with a *Prayer to Saint Joseph* – one of many that may be used privately and collectively.

The Office of Worship will follow-up throughout the coming year with a variety of ways to commemorate this special year but some to consider are:

- Wednesdays – traditionally dedicated to Saint Joseph
- Fourth Sunday of Advent – Joseph's role as a result of the Annunciation
- Christmas – announcing Year of Saint Joseph; using special prayer
- Holy Family Sunday – blessing of Fathers; homily on fatherhood and Saint Joseph
- World Day of the Sick – Jesus and Mary likely tended to Joseph
- March – month dedicated to Saint Joseph; Novena to Saint Joseph prior to 3/19
- March 19 – Solemnity of Saint Joseph (Friday in Lent this year)
- May 1 – Optional Memorial of Saint Joseph the Worker – highlight the dignity of workers
- May 23 – Pentecost; Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church
- June 20 – Father's Day
- September 4/5/6 – Labor Day Weekend – highlight Saint Joseph as Patron of Workers
- November – Saint Joseph, Patron of a Happy Death
- December 8 – Closing of the Year of Saint Joseph


