

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

When we are ordained priests, we always make a card as a memorial of such an important day. On one side there is an icon and at the back, a scriptural passage and the information of the ordination. One of the passages that I almost chose was the last sentence of today's gospel, "For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." The reason I liked this passage is because I feel that the call of each Christian is to serve. Whether as a priest, a married person, widow or single, we are all called to serve one another. As we continue to celebrate the "Respect Life" month, today we will look into how we can serve/help others.

First of all, the service of others does not mean that we do something waiting for something else in return. Nor do we do something for an agenda or a goal that we want to achieve. We serve others because we were served by others first. I'm sorry to quote the famous saying, but it does apply to this situation as well, "everything that goes around, comes around." Although this is often referred to something bad that is done to others comes back to oneself, so should doing something good as well. In this case, God has loved and served us before we were born.

Secondly, it is important to serve all those around us, regardless of who they are. In a passage from the Gospels (Mt 5:46/Lk 6:32) Jesus says, "If you love those who love, what credit is there, even sinners love those who love them." In a sense, if we serve those who serve us, what credit is there? This is the least we should do. (It is true that at times we don't serve those closest to us). We need to serve those in need. Whether it is a person begging on the streets, someone with a disabled car, giving preference for someone else to go ahead in front of you entering in a place or at the intersection. There are many ways we can serve others. We need to be attentive to the needs of others and show acts of kindness to one another so that when the occasion arises, we are there.

Thirdly, we don't judge the other. If we see a person begging for alms, it's very tempting to judge that person as lazy, someone who does not work by choice, or someone who will use the money for their vices. Once I heard a priest saying this and it stuck in my mind that what the other person does with the money or the help we give them, it's something between them and God. However, whether we help that person or not, that will be between God and us! We respond only to our actions. Jesus tells us that every time we serve the least of his brothers, we serve Jesus. **For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you made me welcome,** lacking clothes and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." (Mt 25:35-36). Therefore if we can help a person in need, we can do it out of love for God and our neighbor.

Lastly, we need serve the way we can. Some are called to be leaders on the frontlines helping others. Some are called to contribute with their goods so that people can be helped. Still others are called to support them even in little ways. There is a famous line from Mother Theresa of Calcutta, we cannot do great things, but small things with great love. Whether we can give a quarter, or more, it's imperative to help the person with love. Even when we can't help others, at least we can ask their names and pray for them, or wish them a blessed day. Maybe it's a matter of being prepared to help others, so planning ahead and keep some change in the car. You may have heard the time that I didn't have any money with me when a person asked for help. However at the time I kept a small package of Oreos in the glove compartment in case I could not have lunch. The moment gave the Oreos to this person, he was so happy and it was worth more than anything to him. Although that was my lunch for the day, his joy was my joy!

Brothers & Sisters, today at the end of mass we have another opportunity to help those in need. The Knights of Columbus will be doing their annual Tootsie-Roll drive to help children with disabilities. It's actually known as the "Fund Drive for Children with Intellectual Disabilities" and all funds raised are distributed to agencies who provide day care, respite care, and other support services to families with children with intellectual disabilities. In 2019, the Knights in Massachusetts raised and distributed more than a quarter million dollars to more than 25 agencies in eastern Massachusetts. Our local Council #81 came in 11th among all councils in eastern Massachusetts, and we are hoping to break into the top 10 this year.

I pray we can be generous to others as God has been generous to us! Remember, if God is good all the time and all the time God is good, let's imitate our Heavenly Father by helping those in need around us.

Our Lady of Aparecida

The Brazilian Community will be celebrating Our Lady of Aparecida Sunday after the 9:00am mass. **Our Lady Aparecida** - Our Lady Revealed - (Portuguese: **Nossa Senhora Aparecida** or Portuguese: **Nossa Senhora da Conceição Aparecida** [*ˈnoʁɐ siˈnoɾɐ dɐ kɔ̃sɐjˈsɐw epɐɾɐˈsiðɐ*]) is a title of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the traditional form associated with the Immaculate Conception associated with a clay statue bearing the same title. The image is widely venerated by Brazilian Catholics, who consider her as the principal patroness of Brazil.^[1] Historical accounts state that the statue was originally found by three fishermen who miraculously caught many fish after invoking the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The statue is currently housed in the Basilica of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Aparecida in Aparecida, São Paulo, Brazil.

Colonial documents and papal bulls have referred to the image as *Nossa Senhora da Conceição Aparecida*. The Roman Rite feast day of Our Lady of Aparecida is on October 12, which since 1980 is also a public holiday in Brazil. The building in which it is venerated was granted the title of minor basilica by Pope John Paul II in 1980, and is the largest Marian shrine in the world,^[4] being able to hold up to 45,000 worshippers.^[5]

Brazilian Community Information



Nossa Senhora da Conceição Aparecida

A história de Nossa Senhora da Conceição Aparecida tem seu início pelos meados de 1717, quando chegou a notícia de que o Conde de Assumar, D. Pedro de Almeida e Portugal, Governador da Província de São Paulo e Minas Gerais, iria passar pela Vila de Guaratinguetá, a caminho de Vila Rica, hoje, cidade de Ouro Preto (MG).

Convocados pela Câmara de Guaratinguetá, os pescadores Domingos Garcia, Filipe Pedroso e João Alves saíram à procura de peixes no Rio Paraíba. Desceram o rio e nada conseguiram.

Depois de muitas tentativas sem sucesso, chegaram ao Porto Itaguaçu, onde lançaram as redes e apanharam uma imagem sem a cabeça, logo após, lançaram as redes outra vez e apanharam a cabeça, em seguida lançaram novamente as redes e, dessa vez, abundantes peixes encheram a rede.

Durante anos, a imagem ficou com Filipe, até que presenteou seu filho que, usando de amor à Virgem, fez um oratório simples e passou a se reunir com os familiares e vizinhos, para receber todos os sábados as graças do Senhor por Maria. A fama dos poderes extraordinários de Nossa Senhora foi se espalhando pelas regiões do Brasil.

Por volta de 1734, o Vigário de Guaratinguetá construiu uma Capela no alto do Morro dos Coqueiros, aberta à visitação pública, em 26 de julho de 1745. Mas o número de fiéis aumentava e, em 1834, foi iniciada a construção de uma igreja maior (atual Basílica Velha).

No ano de 1894, chegou a Aparecida um grupo de padres e irmãos da Congregação dos Missionários Redentoristas, para trabalhar no atendimento aos romeiros que acorriam aos pés da Virgem Maria para rezar com a Senhora "Aparecida" das águas.

O Papa Pio X, em 1904, deu ordem para coroar a imagem de modo solene. No dia 29 de abril de 1908, a igreja recebeu o título de Basílica Menor. Grande acontecimento, e até central para a nossa devoção à Virgem, foi quando, em 1929, o Papa Pio XI declarou Nossa Senhora Aparecida Padroeira do Brasil, com estes objetivos: o bem espiritual do povo e o aumento cada vez maior de devotos à Imaculada Mãe de Deus.

Em 1967, completando-se 250 anos da devoção, o Papa Paulo VI ofereceu ao Santuário de Aparecida a Rosa de Ouro, reconhecendo a importância do Santuário e estimulando o culto à Mãe de Deus.

Com o passar do tempo, a devoção a Nossa Senhora da Conceição Aparecida foi crescendo e o número de romeiros foi aumentando cada vez mais. A primeira Basílica tornou-se pequena. Era necessária a construção de outro templo, bem maior, que pudesse acomodar tantos romeiros. Por iniciativa dos missionários Redentoristas e dos Senhores Bispos, teve início, em 11 de novembro de 1955, a construção de uma outra igreja, a atual Basílica Nova. Em 1980, ainda em construção, foi consagrada pelo Papa João Paulo II e recebeu o título de Basílica Menor. Em 1984, a Conferência Nacional dos Bispos do Brasil (CNBB) declarou oficialmente a Basílica de Aparecida Santuário Nacional, sendo o "maior Santuário Mariano do mundo". No ano de 2017, a Igreja comemorou os 300 anos em que a imagem de Nossa Senhora Aparecida foi encontrada por três pescadores nas águas do Rio Paraíba do Sul, no ano 1717.
