


CARE OF THE SICK:

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

FOR YOUR INFORMATION - Often the question is raised concerning any Church regulations allowing for cremation. The Church has always had a great respect for the deceased and encouraged all Catholics to pay proper respect for the faithfully departed. There are basically two regulations that the Church stipulates when considering or planning for a funeral and burial of a deceased loved one. The first stipulation is that it was the expressed desire of the deceased person themselves to be cremated. The second stipulation requires that cremated remains should be buried in hallowed ground.

Earlier this week, a milk crate was left at the door of our church with a letter identifying that the contents in the milk crate was part of a storage container that had been auctioned off. The person who purchased the contents of the storage container did not expect to find a box containing the cremated remains of a deceased gentleman from Waltham, Massachusetts. There was also a guest register from the wake and some documents attesting to its content. The individual thought the best thing he could do was put it in the care of the church and the hands of a priest.

At present I have it still in my possession and hopefully we will be able to track down and contact a relative or friend so that they can properly and respectfully bury the remains instead of putting it in a rented storage container with someone's unwanted property. Thanks to the fact that we have the guest register from the wake that now we can have some avenue to trace where a relative or close friend might still be living.

I mention this specifically because in your funeral planning for you or a loved one. Please remember the stipulations and considerations that the Church ask everyone to make as they fulfill these responsibilities. Remember that the human body is a temple of the Holy Spirit and should be treated with respect and dignity.
