Pastor's Ponderings...

Dear Saint Joseph and All Saints Parishioners:

Jesus Christ did not need to be baptized by Saint John the Baptist. He was God, the Son of the Father, born without sin. What need did he have to be baptized? Many theologians and scholars say the reason why Christ underwent Baptism by Saint John the Baptist was to show how important that Sacrament is to the Christian life.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit and the door which gives us access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons and daughters of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church, and are made sharers in her mission: "Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water in the word." Baptism signifies and actually brings about death to sin and entry into the life of the Most Holy Trinity, through configuration to the Paschal mystery of Christ. It imparts to us a permanent and indelible mark on our souls by which we are eternally claimed for Christ and we are set apart to participate in Christ's priesthood, prophetic mission, and kingly role by the power of the Holy Spirit. Perhaps Jesus said it best: "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and the Spirit." (John 3:5).

How are you living your baptismal grace? While Baptism is an admission into God's family, certain expectations and requirements are asked of each member of that family. In particular, the lay faithful are asked by God to act in a priestly way by offering prayers and sacrifices to God; they are asked to act prophetically by proclaiming the Gospel and building the Kingdom of God on earth; and they are asked to act in a kingly way by exercising servant-leadership over their families and leading them to a deeper relationship with Almighty God through Scripture and the Sacraments of the Church.

Perhaps that should be a point of reflection in our prayer this week: How am I living my baptismal grace and living up to the responsibilities and expectations God has of me as his son or daughter and an heir to eternal life?
