

Pastor's Ponderings...

Dear Saint Joseph and All Saints Parishioners:

Has someone told you before, "Wow! You are so good at that!" Or "I wish I could do that like you can." We are not carbon copies of each other. God has made each of us different and unique. He gave us different gifts and talents so that we complement each other. In fact, if we all had the same gifts and talents, life would be...well, boring.

This weekend's Second Reading from Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians describes how each person receives multitudinous gifts from God which are manifestations of the Holy Spirit alive within us. Some receive the gifts of healing, mighty deeds, prophecy and speaking in tongues. To others God gifts discernment of spirits, interpretation of tongues, etc. These gifts are not only meant to enrich the life of the individual who receives them, they are meant to enrich the life of the Church and should be used to build up the Kingdom of God on Earth.

Before we can use these gifts, however, we must discern which gifts we have received. There is no "hard and fast" way to figure out which gifts you have received. We discern them mostly through prayer, trial, and error. You can test your discernment by using the gift you have recognized and, after a certain time, evaluate the results of your attempt using the following basic rules described by Catholic author Sherry Weddell:

- 1. Effectiveness: A charism will do what it is supposed to do. If you have a charism of teaching, people will learn.
- 2. Your Experience: God does not give charisms as a form of penance. Using this gift usually makes you feel energized, satisfied and joyful, as though this is where you belong.
- 3. Response or Affirmation: It is wonderful when people give you feedback. Lots of positive feedback over time may affirm that you have discerned your gifts correctly.



First Reading:


The prophet Isaiah used marriage imagery (bridge and groom) to describe the Lord's love for his people, Israel. What do you see as some implications of this marriage imagery?
