

Pastor's Ponderings...

Dear Saint Joseph and All Saints Parishioners:

In last week's bulletin article, we discussed Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians and how we must discern the particular gifts give to us by God. Saint Paul picks up this theme again in this weekend's Second Reading and reminds us that the body (of Christ) has many parts. The foot should not be envious that it is not the hand, the eye should not be envious it is not the ear.

We oftentimes become unnecessarily envious of the gifts others receive and we get upset that God has blessed someone else with a gift we wish we received. While it is true that you do not have the gifts other people have, it's simultaneously true that you do have gifts that others do not. Uniqueness is okay. Whenever God gives a gift to someone, it is not only intended for the recipient; it is a gift for the whole Church. We need not be envious of others for the gifts we want; rather, we should rejoice that God has blessed that person with that gift. And furthermore, He has blessed and enriched the Church, the whole body.

Brothers and sisters, be on guard against jealousy and envy in your life. They're foolish sins! "But God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy."

REFLECT

First Reading:

Ezra and Nehemiah were the religious and political leaders of Judah in the mid-5th century BC. They grounded their leadership in Scripture ("the book of the law.") What role does sacred Scripture have in guiding your life?

Second Reading:

Paul used the human body as an analogy for the "many parts" of the Christian community in Corinth that should unite as the "one body" of Christ. In what ways do you find this a challenging vision for community?

Gospel:

Today's reading contains both the opening prologue to the Gospel of Luke and the initial reaction to Jesus' return to his hometown of Nazareth. Luke is the only Evangelist to provide us with a prologue outlining his motivation to write his Gospel. What details do you find most interesting from Luke's prologue?


