

#### **BAPTISM OF THE LORD**

#### First Reading: Isaiah 55:1-11

Today's reading is from a part of Isaiah written when the Jewish people were exiled in Babylon, which is in modern-day Iraq. This section is often referred to as the "book of comfort" because of the encouragement it gives. Today's passage is the finale to this "book of comfort" and uses the image of poor people being invited by God to a joyful banquet.

#### Second Reading: 1 John 5:1-9

In this passage, the author of the first letter of John emphasizes belief in Jesus Christ as *Son of God.* He uses phrases and symbols which describe Christ's baptism, death and resurrection. The Spirit, present at these events, testifies to Christ as Son of God. Such testimony is far superior to any human witness.

**Happy Sunday!** Even as I write this column, the votes for our new parish name are being prepared to be counted and tabulated.

Change is never easy. Change requires stretching and openness. So what will change. Change can also be exciting and new.

Sometime around February 1, 2021 Cardinal O'Malley will select a new name for our newly merged parishes of Holy Rosary and St. John the Evangelist. His selection will come from the three highest vote getters from our balloting. The name Cardinal O'Malley selects will become the new name of our parish. The church names remain the same. St. John Church remains St. John Church and Holy Rosary Church remains Holy Rosary Church. So, what changes?

The parish name changes. Thus, sometime in February if you call the parish office you will no longer hear St. John or Holy Rosary but St. Christopher parish for example. (Poor St. Christopher did not do well in the voting so you are guaranteed that this is not the name of our new parish.) The parish letterhead, bulletin and stationery will change. The checkbook will change. Even the emails of the parish staff will change. Membership on our finance council, buildings and grounds committee and technology committee will have to change in order to accommodate representation from both churches for our newly blended parish.

Two important goals that I have once the new parish is named is to purchase a statue of our patron saint and to begin the work of forming a Parish Council. The representatives will be your representatives and my chief advisors for developing a plan of mission for our new parish. It will be the work of the Parish Council to establish goals for one, three and five years. It will consist of representation of men and women from both parishes. Together we will work to identify what is most important in both communities as we become one. This excites and energizes me!

No doubt there will be unexpected blessings and crosses that come from this change in name. Hopefully, we will figure it out together. Until we know the name of our new patron saint: All Holy Men and Women pray for us!

Prince of Peace. Amen.


#### IS THERE ANYONE SICK AMONG YOU?
