FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY First Reading: 1 Samuel 1:20-22, 24-28

Today's reading takes place eleven centuries before Christ at an Israelite shrine, which is referred to as a "temple" in the text. When Hannah, who was childless, visited this shrine previously, Eli the high priest had promised that she would bear a son. Today's reading picks up from there. (Christians have seen Hannah as a symbol of Mary.)

Second Reading: 1 John 3:1-2, 21-24

The first letter of John was written for the community whose leader produced the fourth Gospel. Today's passage describes in very familiar and understandable terms our close relationship with God.

We share with you this reflection from Liturgical Publications on the Holy Family:

Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments All in the Family

At first glance, we can often find the image of the Blessed Mother, Saint Joseph and the Christ Child intimating—who are we to aspire to that level of discipleship? How could we ever hope to conform ourselves to that mold? Sometimes, it can even be painful—perhaps we hail from a broken family or struggle with a broken relationship within our family, or perhaps we long to be a mother or a father ourselves and that state in life has eluded us.

But the image of the Holy Family is, in reality, a beautiful invitation to us all, no matter our vocation or our state in life, and the example of Mary, Joseph and Jesus is rich with the symbolism of stewardship.
