

#### SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME First Reading: Isaiah 62:1-5



#### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11



#### An In-Depth Exploration of *Lumen Gentium*, A Dogmatic Constitution of the 2nd Vatican Council

The mission of the Church is to be the light of Christ in and to the world. How is this lofty endeavor to be lived out in the life of the Church? And what does it mean for our own personal pursuit of holiness? Join Fr. Chris O'Connor and Graceanne Bowe for a 5-week series on "Lumen Gentium", the principal document of the Second Vatican Council. We will explore the themes of Christian unity; the role of Church hierarchy, laity, and religious; the universal call to holiness for everyone, regardless of their vocation; and our membership in the Mystical Body of Christ. The goal of the series is for participants to come away with a deeper understanding of the life of holiness as the participation in something that is greater than ourselves—Christ's Church.

Lord God, Father of all life, we praise and honor you. We thank you for the gift of life that in your great love you have graciously bestowed on us.


Gather our nation to yourself so that we might be transformed by your Light.
