

Reflection for Ash Wednesday:

Today's Gospel reminds us that all of our giving, whether of alms or of service, must always be done for love of God alone and not for the applause of our brothers and sisters.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

On Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent, the Church requests all over 14 years of age to abstain from meat. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, the Church requests all between the ages of 18 to 60 having one full meal and two smaller meals for nourishment and strength. Liquids are allowed throughout the day.

The Faithful enjoy freedom of conscience to excuse themselves from these regulations but, as U.S. Bishops state, "No Catholic Christian will likely excuse themselves from so hallowed an obligation" on these days.

EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME First Reading: Sirach 27:4-7

The book of Sirach was written by a wise teacher who lived 200 years before Christ. It is a loose collection of wise sayings dealing with various concerns in the life of a believer. In today's section, we hear Sirach's thoughts about how speech is the measure of a person.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:54-58

This is the last of our seven weeks of readings from first Corinthians. In recent weeks, we have heard Paul addressing the Corinthian converts' questions about life after death. Paul ends his teaching on the resurrection with this hymn of triumph over death.

GIVE US THIS JOYFUL SEASON By Br. Silas Henderson of LPI Publications

It seems that, in many ways, we would be hard-pressed to have better readings for the Sunday before Lent begins. These teachings of Jesus—on judging others and the fruitfulness of our lives—help round out the sixth chapter of Luke and what we now know as Jesus' "sermon on the plain". Here, we find Jesus inviting us to reflect on the movements taking place within our minds and hearts, particularly with regard to how we relate to other people.

The Season of Lent is a time for Christians to "get back to basics", focusing on the quality of our discipleship. This means that Lent isn't an end in itself. Rather, Lent—which comes from an Old English word meaning "springtime"—is ultimately oriented toward our celebrations of the Resurrection at Easter and our renewal of our Baptism Promises on Easter Sunday. We are reminded of this by the words of the Mass, as we recall that God "gives us this joyful season when we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery with mind and heart renewed ...as we recall the great events that gave us new life in Christ".

As we know, the traditional *bona opera* ("good works") of Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These actions focus our attention on what is most important in our relationships with God and others, while enabling us to set aside some of the "stuff" that consumes our time and energy, or which distract us from what is truly important. To that end, this Sunday's First Reading and Gospel can help reflect on the movements of our heart that should guide these acts of penance and charity, especially as we think about what might be obscuring our spiritual vision and preventing us from recognizing the sometimes-hard truths about where we might be in our journey of faith and commitment to follow Jesus on the path of conversion.

With this in mind, we can also look to our Second Reading, taken from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians as a reminder that the grace of conversion called for by the Season of Lent comes to us only through the victory of Christ and it is by this grace that we know "that in the Lord [our] labor is not in vain". As Pope Francis reflected in his 2019 Message for Lent: "Let us not allow this season of grace to pass in vain! Let us ask God to help us set out on a path of true conversion. Let us leave behind our selfishness and self-absorption, and turn to Jesus' Pasch. Let us stand beside our brothers and sisters in need, sharing our spiritual and material goods with them. In this way, by concretely welcoming Christ's victory over sin and death into our lives, we will also radiate its transforming power to all creation."

In essence, these readings are inviting us to look at our lives and on the realities of the world around us with clear eyes and to reflect on the fruit of our lives. Are there areas in our lives that need to be more carefully nurtured and tended? Are there "branches" that need to be pruned, so that other areas of our lives—including our prayer and ministry—can be more fruitful? How can we more effectively respond to the needs of those around us, sharing our time, talent, and material goods to help others to bear greater fruit in their own lives?
