



#### FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

#### First Reading: Isaiah 43:16-21

This section of the book of Isaiah contains the words of a prophet who addressed God's people exiled in Babylon (located in modern-day Iraq). He encourages them that one day they will be free to return home to Jerusalem. This journey will be through the desert, but God will transform this barren wasteland to ease their passage home. Second Reading: Philippians 3:8-14

The city of Philippi was located in what is today northeastern Greece, a country where Olympic-type games were popular. Paul draws upon this image to motivate the people to keep pressing forward in their spiritual growth.

#### A Meditation on today's Gospel From "The Word Among Us"

Go, and from now on do not sin any more. (John 8:11)

Jesus' words to this woman who was caught in the act of adultery were more than a warning. They were more than advice to get her act together or improve herself. In seeing these words, Jesus—the Word of God through whom everything came to be—was speaking a creative and healing word. He was giving her the power to go—to walk away from her former way of life—and to begin living a new way.

This is one of many stories in the Gospel of John that recount Jesus bringing healing and new life to someone. He said to a royal official, "Go; your son will live", and the boy recovered (John 4:50). He said to the man lying by the pool of Bethesda, "Rise, take up your mat, and walk," and he was healed (5:8). He said to Lazarus, "Come out ", and the dead man rose (11:43). Clearly, when Jesus spoke, God's power was present to do something new.

By saying these words, Jesus wasn't just forgiving the woman. He was—as Isaiah describes in our first reading—making a way for her through the wasteland of her sin and offering her strength and restoration (Isaiah 43:19).

You can have a similar experience when you come to Jesus in repentance, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As you open your heart and your conscience to him, let him speak words of healing and restoration to you. Let him do something new in you.

So look for an opportunity to go to Confession before Easter. Trust that the One who said, "Let there be light" is ready to speak words of healing and strength into your woundedness and weakness (Genesis 1:3). As the priest prays that God would bring you "pardon and peace", know that Jesus never tires of speaking these words to you. Every time you come to him, you can be strengthened and receive the grace you need to begin again.

"Jesus, give me the grace to go and sin no more."

The Congress, which closes out the Archdiocese "Year of the Eucharist", includes Mass with Cardinal Sean O'Malley, a line-up of powerhouse of speakers including Bishop Robert Barron, Deacon Harold Burke-Sivers, and Eucharistic Adoration and Procession. St. Michael's has secured a block of tickets so that parishioners may attend together. The cost is \$53 per person, which includes admission to the Congress and a boxed lunch.
