

PENTECOST SUNDAY

First Reading: Acts 2: 1-11

Pentecost was a Jewish feast that celebrated the beginning of the harvest. It took place 50 days after the feast of Passover. Jewish pilgrims came to Jerusalem from all over the ancient world for the celebration of the feast. Today we hear how Pentecost became a Christian feast.

Second Reading: Romans 8:8-17

Today's passage comes from chapter 8 of Paul's letter to the Romans, which stresses the importance of the Holy Spirit in the lives of Christians. Paul wants us to remember that the Spirit who will raise our bodies on the last day is the same Spirit who inspires us to holiness every day. Today Paul offers a sharp contrast between life in the flesh (meaning, *life prone to sin*) and life in the Spirit.

HOLY ROSARY CHURCH

To keep all parishioners informed, a process has begun to relegate Holy Rosary Church. This process of selling the Church (in its beginning stages) does not come lightly or without sadness. The following steps have been taken: consultation and many meetings with former parishioners of Holy Rosary Parish including a recent meeting after the 11:00am Mass in the Holy Rosary Chapel, meetings with the parish finance committee, parish council and the buildings and grounds committee as well as discussions with the Archdiocesan leadership team. All of these parish committees have ample representation from the former Holy Rosary and St. John the Evangelist parishes.

Holy Rosary Church has been vacant now for almost two years because of a broken boiler which was cost prohibitive to fix. The serious reasons for the relegation of Holy Rosary Church are the following: For many years annual deficits and financial difficulties, excessive deferred maintenance, operating costs not being met, and the prohibitive costs of bringing the church up to current building codes. The Congress, which closes out the Archdiocese "Year of the Eucharist", includes Mass with Cardinal Sean O'Malley, a line-up of powerhouse speakers including Bishop Robert Barron, Deacon Harold Burke-Sivers, and Eucharistic Adoration and Procession. 
ST. MICHAEL THE ARCHANGEL PRAYER
