The Book of Proverbs is mostly a collection of wise sayings to help people live a good life. Today's passage from Proverbs, however, is a hymn to Wisdom which in the Old Testament is sometimes symbolically described as a person coming from God.

Paul's letter to the Romans is his most detailed and important theological work. The Church chose this brief passage to be read on Trinity Sunday because, in these five verses, all three persons of the Trinity are mentioned.

A Meditation on the Gospel
From The Word Among Us

The Most Holy Trinity

I have much more to tell you. (John 16:12)

Had Jesus run out of time? Why didn't he tell his disciples everything he had in mind? Had the Last Supper taken too long?

No, Jesus' timing was always perfect. He knew his hour had come—it hadn't snuck up on him. And he was always ready for whatever he had to do. Rather, Jesus had "much more" to teach his disciples because they weren't ready to hear it. They couldn't understand everything yet. They needed time and experience—and a lot of help from the Holy Spirit.

Like those disciples, we have much more to learn. We don't quite comprehend a lot of what Jesus teaches, and we need the Spirit's help to live out the things that we do understand. Take today's feast of the Holy Trinity as a classic example. Every Sunday we proclaim that we believe in one God in three divine Persons: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. But the Trinity is a mystery we will never fully comprehend. Jesus certainly has a lot he can teach us—about the Trinity and so much more. He unfolds these mysteries for us over our lifetime, as we seek him and open ourselves to the Spirit.

How blessed we are! Jesus loves to reveal his truths to us, and he offers us everything we need to understand him. He has overcome the sin that clouds our minds and hinders us from seeking and knowing God. Not only that, but he has given us the Spirit, who lives in us and helps us understand the truths of our faith. And he has given us the Church, where we receive the Scriptures, the sacraments, and brothers and sisters who love us. All these things help to reveal more and more to us about the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

There's always more to learn from the Lord. Jesus is ready. Are you?

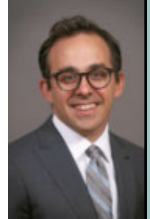
