



#### First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20

Today's reading from the book of Genesis tells us all we know about an obscure king named Melchizedek. Abraham had just won a military victory, and Melchizedek honors him with a meal of bread and wine. Over the course of time, this meal was seen as a distant foreshadowing of the Eucharist, which is why this passage was chosen for today's feast.

#### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

The first letter to the Corinthians was written about 25 years after Christ's death and resurrection. Today's passage contains our earliest written account of what Jesus did at the Last Supper. It predates even the Gospels.

Today, Sunday, June 19th: The Feast of the Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. After the 12pm Mass there will be a small Eucharistic procession around the Church neighborhood. It is hoped that many will join us in this procession testifying to Christ's true presence in the Eucharist.



Today we celebrate Father's Day. We honor our fathers and thank them for giving us life, for nurturing that life within us and for helping us to be all that we can be. We pray for our fathers, both living and deceased, at all the Masses.

#### A Meditation on the Body and Blood of Christ From The Word Among Us

This is my body that is for you. (1 Corinthians 11:24)

Have you ever seen a carpet of flowers? Throughout the world, people celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ with Eucharistic processions that take place on streets covered with intricate, ornate "carpets" of flower petals. These carpets recreate religious art work or depict holy symbols or designs. Children often follow the procession, joyfully dancing and throwing the flower petals into the air!

Joy seems to be a central message of today's feast. It's a day to rejoice in the very real presence of Jesus with us.

We rejoice in Jesus, who inaugurated a *new* covenant between God and his creation by offering himself on the cross. We affirm that covenant each time we eat his Body and drink his Blood in the Eucharist. And we celebrate God's love for us.

We rejoice that Jesus is *with us* in the Blessed Sacrament: Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. He has not left us orphans; he is close to us in every tabernacle in the world. So we lift our hearts in praise and thanks.

We rejoice that Jesus provides for all of our needs. He feeds our deepest hungers for peace, or healing, or closeness to God. When he multiplied the loaves and fish, he gave us just a glimpse into the fulfillment we can experience when he feeds us his own divine life in Holy Communion. As we receive him, we celebrate the unending life he offers us.

Today is a day to reflect on Jesus, minister of the new covenant in his blood. It's a day to ponder the mystery of his presence with us under the appearance of bread and wine. But don't forget about the flowers. Take some time to rejoice and praise Jesus!
