Pastoral Reflections from Father Anthony 2nd SUNDAY OF LENT

In today's Gospel, joy suddenly came to the three disciples of Jesus as a gift. That night, a night like many, Jesus went up to the mountain to pray with his three disciples. He was deeply immersed in an intimate dialogue with his Father. He knew quite well what awaited him: suffering, humiliation, death, and resurrection (Lk 9:22). Jesus took the road the Father wanted him to go.

It was late at night, and Jesus was still talking to the Father. The disciples were deeply asleep. When they suddenly woke up, they were ecstatic at the extraordinary sight. Jesus was conversing with Moses and Elijah. Radiant glory engulfed the three. Jesus' face changed and even his clothing became dazzling white (Lk 9:29).

It is unclear how long the disciples contemplated this scene, but they certainly wanted to prolong that happiness. As Moses and Elijah were about to part from Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, it is good that we are here; let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" (Lk 9:33).

What a beautiful night! What a mysterious night! Night was brightened up as day! Suddenly a cloud enveloped the disciples, taking them into the mystery of the divine presence. They were terrified when they saw how close God was to man. All that had occurred was to prepare the disciples to listen to the introduction of the Father, "This is my chosen Son" and welcome his message, "listen to him" (Lk 9:35).

The experience of seeing Jesus' glory was essential for the disciples because it enabled them to boldly go forward with Jesus to Jerusalem where they would accept his same fate to share in his glory Lk 9:23-26). The glory of the Son of God was hidden by being made man. That glory was revealed when he was transfigured on the mountain. But even after the Resurrection, he did not show all of his glory. His complete glory will shine forth only when he returns. Thus, the cloud eventually disappeared. Moses and Elijah also departed. Only Jesus remained, with a usual face like so many others, with the road of sacrifice and salvation ahead. Then the next day, Jesus and his disciples went down the mountain to bring the Good News of God's love to everyone.

During this holy season of Lent, we need to see the Lord's glorious radiance. And we also need to be transformed. True repentance leads to transformation. It may come through deep praying, through quiet fasting, and through sharing with others as well. May we also be transformed through changing the way we think and the way we live so


that people can see the joyful face of God in our smiles, his gentleness in our words and his mercy in our hands. The world today does not need Christians with faces of frustration and disappointment, but God needs those who have patience and courage to accompany him and others on the bumpy roads of life that are full of difficulties and challenges. Amen.




