Here in Boston it means that we will be gathering, as parishes and as a diocese to pray together and to invite the Holy Spirit to help us to listen deeply to one another, and we will talk together about how best to do that. So, for instance, a parish council may get together and ask "How can we as a parish council do a better job of letting the voices of all our parishioners be heard, even those who are not a part of an inner circle or who might be marginalized for whatever reason?" The archdiocese and the church around the world will be engaging in the same sort of conversation. We pray that the Lord will open our hearts to Him and to all of our people.

The Epiphany and 3 Kings "We three kings of Orient are Bearing gifts we travel afar... Following yonder star We three kings, we three kings Born a king on Bethlehem's plain... King forever, ceasing never Over us all to reign Oh, star of wonder, star of night Star with royal beauty bright Westward leading, still proceeding Guide us to thy perfect light..."

The feast of manifestation, or Epiphany, is traditionally celebrated the 12th day after Christmas, January 6th. In the dioceses of the United States this feast has been moved to the Sunday between January 2 and January 8.

"Epiphany" means "manifestation" and it comes from Greek roots that mean "to show, to display" (phainein) and "on, to" (epi-). Thus, an epiphany is a time when something is shown, displayed, or manifested to an audience.

The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Son of God and Savior of the world. The feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men from the East, together with His baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee (His first public miracle).

The magi were representatives of neighboring pagan religions who welcomed the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. These Wise Men, in coming to Jerusalem to pay homage to the King of the Jews showed that they sought, in Israel, the messianic light of the star of David, the one who would be King of the Nations. Summarily: all can discover Jesus and worship Him as God and Savior.

Can you see Christ in others? Do others see Christ in you through your thoughts, words and actions? Are you so full of joy that comes knowing, loving and serving God that others want to draw near to Him as well? Perhaps this can become your new years goal.

MLK Jr. Trip

For ten of the past eleven years, the youth of Saint Margaret Mary Parish have celebrated the Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday by collecting socks, hats, gloves, scarves, hand and feet warmers, men's toiletries, and gift cards for the homeless of Boston. 
