From the Desk of Father Bob

Today is the **Feast of the Baptism of the Lord** and the finale of the Christmas season. The significance of this feast is that it was at His Baptism in the Jordan River that Jesus was identified as God's Son. Appropriately so, Jesus' Baptism is one of the mysteries of the Epiphany, celebrated last week. It was by the visit of the Magi, Baptism in the Jordan and first public miracle at the wedding at Cana the God manifests to the world that Jesus is the Christ and Savior. Remember that St. Joseph was told by an angel that he was to name the baby Jesus, because he would *save* His people from their sins. The name Jesus means *the one who saves*.

So why this feast if we have already commemorated the Baptism of the Lord during the celebration of Epiphany last week? The Church uses every opportunity to put before us our own Baptism. Given that most of us were infants at the time of Baptism, we don't have any memory of it. Without reminders, therefore, we are likely to forget it altogether. If we forget our baptism it's not long before we forget our faith. When we were baptized, God claimed us as His very own. Didn't that happen by virtue of being created by God? Yes, but through baptism we are united with Jesus Christ into the saving paschal mystery: dying and rising. The paschal mystery is our inheritance, you could say. God bestows to each of His children a "right" to claim the Kingdom as his/her own. Blessing ourselves with holy water is the simplest way that we recall our baptism.

Tomorrow (Monday) we begin Ordinary Time again. This liturgical season has two parts. The first begins after the Baptism of the Lord and goes up until Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. This year Lent begins on March 2. The second part of Ordinary Time begins on the day after Pentecost Sunday (June 5) and concludes on the day before the First Sunday of Advent (November 27). We think of Ordinary as being the part of the liturgical year which is not "special" like Christmas or Easter because we think of ordinary as the opposite of special. Actually, Ordinary, in the language of the Church, refers to the *proper sequencing* of the events that bring us to the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ. That is to say, the events are put into proper order. Having said that, the proper order does not necessarily mean historical order. Rather the events show Christ's earthly mission leading to the Cross. You will notice in Luke's Gospel, which will be used for most of the Sunday Gospels this year, that there is a focus on Jerusalem. In fact, in one of the Gospel readings during the summer you will hear that Jesus makes a resolution to go to Jerusalem where he will suffer and die. It demonstrates His intention for the Paschal Mystery into which you and I were baptized!

Baptism of the Lord — January 9, 2022

Our gospel recounts the story of Jesus' baptism and the important words spoken by God about Jesus, "You are my beloved Son." 
