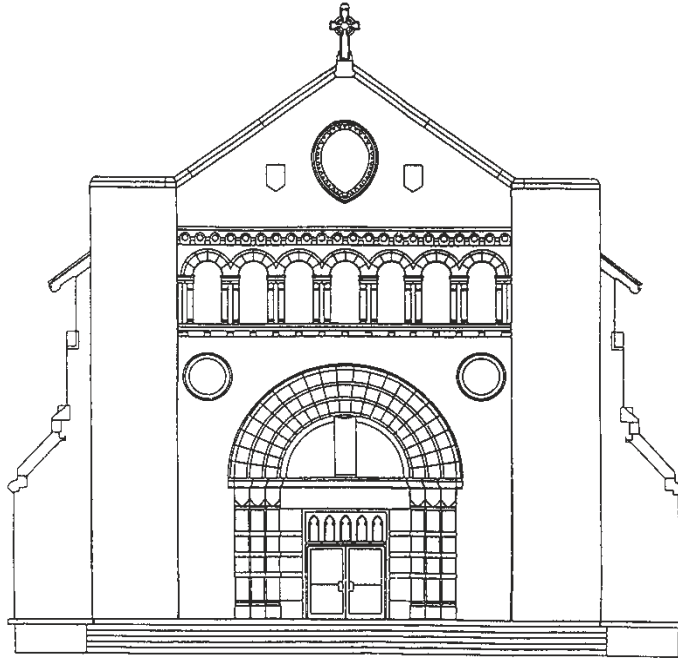

GUIDELINES FOR LENT

Lent runs from Ash Wednesday up to, but excluding, the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.

Abstinence: Abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent (for those 14 and older) is required by Church law.

Fasting: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting: those between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less, meaning, take no solid food between meals and only one full meal that day. Serious health conditions excuse a person from these precepts.

FR. KRIS' KORNER

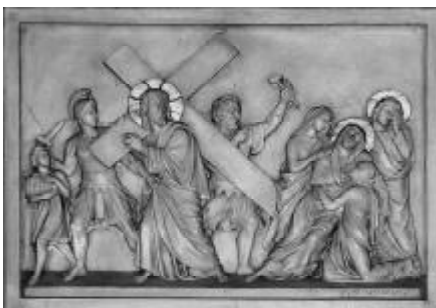


“Let he who is without sin cast the first stone.” Most of us are very familiar with this phrase. The story of the Adulterous Woman is very significant in our understanding of Jesus’ mercy and forgiveness. “This woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery,” which means the woman was probably set up and was being used as a pawn by those with utter disregard for her wellbeing. They didn’t care whether she lived or died - all this treachery was simply to trap Jesus! Through Jesus’ quick thinking and compassion, not only was the woman saved and forgiven, others’ hearts were touched as evidenced by putting down their stones and walking away. So, a few things for thought... Have you ever used someone as a pawn; used them for your own gain or heartless amusement? Sadly, I’ve known many couples going through awful divorces who used their innocent children as pawns to get back at the other spouse. Every time you look at pornography, you are using someone for your own amusement – turning a blind eye to the sex industry with its many victims both young and old. Using others is a sin of enormous gravity. And how often do you hurl stones at someone who has sinned; i.e. how often do you judge another who has sinned and wish some kind of injury upon them? Every time you get a thrill from sharing gossip or slander, you are throwing stones maliciously at a defenseless victim. You don’t want to answer for this as you stand before the Lord on your personal judgment day. Jesus said, “Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven.” Has your heart become as hard as stone? Are you so self-righteous that you are unable to admit your own sinfulness? Or has Jesus’ example of mercy dissuaded you from criticizing and condemning others? Let us all put down our stones!

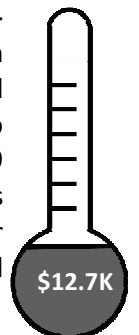
