Deacon Mike's Retirement

Deacon Mike Iwanowicz, ordained in 1976 with the history-making, first group of Permanent Deacons for the Archdiocese of Boston, began his affiliation with Our Lady of Sorrows Parish in 1982 when he and his wife

Pat started participating in the life of the parish. This affiliation was strengthened in 1984 when Mike, while assigned to the Archdiocese of Boston's Family Life Apostolate, began serving at various parish liturgical and sacramental celebrations. This led to the Archbishop of Boston assigning Mike as the Permanent Deacon for Our Lady of Sorrows Parish in 1988. This assignment has continued to the present moment.

After being associated with the parish for over 30 years and serving as our assigned Permanent Deacon for 25 years, Mike has decided to retire on June 30, 2013. Though Mike will have the title "Senior Deacon" and maintain a relationship with the parish in his retirement, the Parish Staff has scheduled two opportunities for parishioners to acknowledge and thank Deacon Mike for his dedicated and faithful ministry to Our Lady of Sorrows Parish and the Archdiocese of Boston and to assure him of our prayers and best wishes for this next phase of his life.

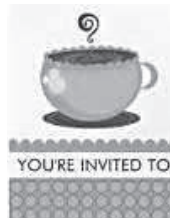

Pope Francis has sent this message to the Archbishop of Oklahoma City:

Living the Gospel – Trinity

Every time we make the sign of the cross we reaffirm our belief in a God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Although some people have difficulties with the gender-specific language of "Father" and "Son" and look for other ways to express this reality, all Christian people profess a belief in the one God who is experienced in three distinct ways. We are baptized "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" and we remind ourselves of this reality when we pray and when we bless ourselves or others.

Reflection/Discussion Questions for Adults

- Why do some people accuse Christians of worshipping three Gods, not one?
- In what ways do you find three different expressions of God to be helpful?
- What did Jesus mean by saying that the Spirit "will not be speaking as from himself"?
- Why do many people attribute a feminine quality to the Holy Spirit?
- How would you describe your understanding of the Trinity?

The average cost to run the parish is \$10,000 per week and our expectation is that 73% (\$7,350) will come from the weekly offertory. On May 19, the parishioners contributed \$6,315.55.

However, parish expenses do not take a vacation. As you know, most of our operating expenses are in salaries and benefits. These do not go away during the summer months. While we save on heat and snow removal, we have the comfort and added expenses of an air conditioned church. To allow the parish to continue to meet its financial obligations through the summer months and to give us a strong start to the new fiscal year which begins on July 1, we ask that you remain committed to the weekly offertory through the summer months. To do this, please consider:

- Using the parish envelopes and mailing your weekly/monthly offertory contribution while you are away.
- Using online banking to make regular contributions to the offertory throughout the year.
- Making your offertory contribution before or after your vacation, if your means allow.
