# Padre's Ponderings

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we are given an opportunity to reflect on the greatest treasure we possess this side of heaven: Jesus' abiding presence in the Most Holy Eucharist. We will observe Corpus Christi by concluding every Mass with the Rite of Exposition and Benediction, an ancient ceremony that reminds us that Jesus is truly present to us in the Blessed Sacrament—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under the appearance of bread and wine. As Pope-Emeritus Benedict reminded the young people gathered for World Youth Day in Cologne in 2005: "the happiness you are seeking, the happiness you have a right to enjoy has a name and a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth, hidden in the Eucharist." Eucharist.

As we celebrate Jesus' presence in the Eucharist this weekend, we also rejoice with the children who received this precious gift in their **First Holy Communion** at a celebration on Saturday. Please keep them and their families in your prayers. Many thanks to those who helped prepare them for the big day, especially Carolyn Mello Pryor and our devoted catechists.

In other news, we are blessed at SMB by the diaconal ministry of **Deacon John Pryor**. He has shown our community how much the vocation to the permanent diaconate can help advance the work of the Church. In that light, I am pleased to announce that Bishop Tobin has recently authorized the recruitment and formation of a permanent descent. new class of permanent deacons. I know that there are men in our community who are eligible for this important form of ordained service. Among the requirements are these:

be a practicing Catholic layman who will be at least 35 years of age at the time of ordination and be not older than 61 on January 1st in the year of recruitment have a high school diploma or equivalent be a fully initiated Catholic in good standing with the

have a familiarity with Catholic Theology should be actively involved in ministry at either the

parish or diocesan level if married, be in a stable marriage of at least 5 years (at the time of application) and have the support and agreement of his wife and family to pursue a diaconal

if unmarried (being single or a widower), to be living in a lifestyle consistent with the call to the ordained ministry in the celibate state within the Catholic

If you meet these criteria and feel that God may be calling you to a life of ordained service, please speak to me or to Deacon John. Deacon John, in fact, has been asked by the diocesan director of the Diaconate Office to participate in the formation of the new class of deacons. # Ask the Deacon

#### Deacon John, why should we have Masses offered for the dead?

In a prior column, we discussed that the Church honors the memory of the dead. November is the month in which we remember, in a particular way, the dead. We pray for our departed loved ones because we believe that our prayers, sacrifices, and especially the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, provide assistance to the souls in Purgatory.

According to Catholic Straight Answers, "the offering of Masses for the repose of the soul of the faithful departed is linked with our belief in Purgatory. We believe that if a person has died fundamentally believing in God but with venial sins and the hurt caused by sin, then God in His divine love and mercy will first purify the soul. After this purification has been completed, the soul will have the holiness and purity needed to share in the beatific vision in heaven."

We pray for our loved ones and each other. We pray to help each other on the path of salvation. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the best prayer that we can offer to the departed souls undergoing purification. We are part of the communion of saints, which includes the church triumphant in Heaven, the church militant on earth, and the church suffering in Purgatory. We are all connected because we belong to the Church, the body of Christ. Of course, we want to help each other. We are family!

In 1902, Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical Mirae caritatis ("Mirror of Charity") emphasized the connection between the communion of saints with the Mass: "The grace of mutual love among the living, strengthened and increased by the Sacrament of the Eucharist, flows, especially by virtue of the Sacrifice [of the Mass], to all who belong to the communion of saints. For the communion of saints is simply... the mutual sharing of help, atonement, prayers, and benefits among the faithful, those already in the heavenly fatherland, those consigned to the purifying fire, and those still making their pilgrim way here on earth. These all form one city, whose head is Christ, and whose vital principle is love. Faith teaches that although the august Sacrifice can be offered to God alone, it can nevertheless be celebrated in honor of the saints now reigning in heaven with God, who has crowned them, to obtain their intercession for us, and also, according to apostolic tradition, to wash away the stains of those brethren who died in the Lord but without yet being wholly purified."

One may wonder, "What if the person's soul has already been purified and gone to heaven?" We do not know the time or the hour of God's judgment. So, it makes sense to remember our deceased brothers and sisters, commending them to God through prayer and sacrifice. According to Catholic Straight Answers, "However, if indeed the departed soul has been purified and now rests in God's presence in heaven, then those prayers and sacrifices offered benefit the other souls in purgatory through the love and mercy of God."

Having a Mass offered for the repose of a person's soul is beneficial and comforting. Most importantly, we should always remember our own dearly departed loved ones in the Holy Mass, and through our own prayers and sacrifices help them in their gaining eternal rest.


