

A Joyful Message



Many years ago, I found my first spiritual director. It took me a long time to find her, but with some persistent searching, I was encouraged to contact a Trappistine monastery in Wrentham, Massachusetts, which housed 49 cloistered nuns at the time. My letter of inquiry was eventually given to one of the founders of the monastery, who agreed to keep correspondence with me. The Trappistines are otherwise known as members of "The Cistercian Order of Strict Observance", and I did not expect anything more than a correspondence. Yet, through that strict monastic enclosure and through her letters, she was to swing open the contemplative doors of a boundless love for silence and scriptural reflection.

In her first brief letter to me, "Sister Anna" sent a bookmark that she had created herself. It was small and plain, but the personal handwriting and scripture passage she chose were exquisite:

"In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there." Mk 1:35

She signed the back of the bookmark: "He prays in you. Let's pray for each other." It was so simple, yet so profound, and that single bookmark became a guidepost for me on seeking solitude to develop an interior life of prayer. That was almost 40 years ago...why mention it now?

January in New England seems to be the perfect time for all of us to pause and be still, after the festivities of Christmas. Perhaps you don't like the cold, or perhaps you are simply tired from all the gaiety and gatherings of December, or perhaps another developing spike of Covid-19 has been your invitation to pull back in some interior manner, to see or to hear what gift is available to you in the quiet. This opportunity exists for all of us. Whatever it might be that calls us to slow down and take stock...let's listen to that. Can we find that place to pray, long before dawn, as "Sister Anna" and the Book of Mark offer for our consideration? In doing so, is it possible that we might find some measure of serenity?

I just finished reading "Fifty Days of Solitude" by Doris Grumbach. This journal was written by the author as an experiment, as she had an opportunity to spend 50 days entirely alone, during a winter at home on the coast of Maine. Would she be able to do it? With her television silent and her phone calls sent to messaging, she discovered much about herself and her time alone with the Great Alone. She wrote:

"When I prayed alone in the morning or evening, God seemed nearby or at least available to my unspoken words. Without the distractions of other persons, without the extraneous sounds of their voices and my own, I felt the presence of God...not a noisy landscape of the mind but a still life."


This sort of statement can pique our interest, yet it is so easy to delay the opportunity to take it slow, to seek out the quiet, and to find God waiting for us in the silence of our hearts. And yet, January and its promise of a new year seem to be ideally suited to this type of endeavor.

"Sister Anna" lived to be 97, and was a spiritual director and role model for me throughout many years when I was yearning for some guidance and companionship in my journey of soul. I still have her bookmark, which has gathered a smudge or two throughout the years, living deep inside the pages of many a book on prayer.

May you find some meaningful moments this January... within a quiet place, a silent space, where the Divine Presence is waiting for you.
