Padre's Ponderings

Dear Parishioners,

This holy and blessed day is the first of the week, the king and master of all days, the feast of feasts and the season of seasons. On this day we bless Christ forever and ever.

O faithful, come on this day of the glorious resurrection: let us drink the wine of the new vineyard, of the divine joy, of the kingdom of Christ! Let us praise him as our God forever and ever!"

These words from the Orthodox liturgy of Easter Sunday remind us of the singular importance of this day. This is truly the day Lord has made! Let us rejoice and be glad! Alleluia! For forty long days, we have abstained from the use of that exclamation of joyful praise: Alleluia! Now we let it echo loudly in our church and in our hearts! (And we look forward to our Mountain Movers next weekend unfurling their Alleluia banner which was "buried" right before Lent!)

Easter reminds us every year of the power of light over darkness, the power of love over hate, the power of life over death! In the risen Jesus, we find the strength that helps us to keep believing and hoping and loving even in the valley of the shadow of death. We are reminded today that no matter how dark the night might seem, there is always a bright morning to look forward to. That is not mere wishful thinking. For Christians, it is certain hope! Because of the empty tomb, darkness and hate and death never get the last word! Alleluia indeed!

As we renew our baptismal promises this morning, we recommit ourselves to following Jesus. There is no life apart from him, and if he is truly risen, then everything is changed! As Saint Paul tells us, if Christ has not been raised, then our faith is in vain. But because he is risen, we live differently! Our entire lives are meant to become a sign of the dying and rising of Jesus, and are meant to point others toward our heavenly destiny. So let us renew our baptismal promises today with joyful determination to truly be an "Easter people"!

The Warren Parks and Recreation Department received a NRPA/OJJDP grant to create the Warren Youth mentoring program. Requirements for mentees: Parental approval, Warren Resident, Commitment of 1 year, Be respectful & openminded, Willing to participate, Considerate of Mentor's time, Recommendation from school, parent/guardian, coaches, community organizations

GOSPEL MEDITATION

ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

There are many stones in our paths that keep us from truly living and being free. Some of these boulders have been there for a very long time. They have been there so long that they have even settled into the soil of our lives with other weeds, vines, and compacted soil keeping them firmly in place. We find them hard to move and trying to do so can be exhausting. What are these suffocating albatrosses that keep us so tethered and immobile? They are many things.

They are past childhood wounds and hurts that stem from disappointment, rejection, or abuse. People may have told us we were unwanted, that the world is frightening, that there are only some acceptable feelings you can have and others you cannot. We may have tried to love someone or struggled to figure out how and were met with rejection. Maybe we trusted someone completely and were betrayed. We come to life collecting barnacles that begin to attach to other barnacles and before you know it, we have a mass of solid matter blocking our vision and keeping us from moving. We live in fear. We are



afraid of losing what we have, afraid that the future will be empty, afraid that we won't succeed and even more afraid that we will not be loved. There is so much fear. Didn't Jesus tell us not to worry and to not be afraid? Either we believe in the message of Easter, or we don't!

Go confidently into the night. Walking with God you will find the light and strength you need. Often without even knowing, God will move those boulders and stumbling blocks that bind us and, with putting one foot in front of the other and looking forward, we will move. The

resurrection of Christ is really all about receiving the gifts of trust and faith and doing new things. The rocks that bind us keep us spinning the same wheels and doing the same things. When was the last time you threw caution to the wind and actually did something totally out of character and different? This is where we find God, in the spontaneous, the adventurous, the fun, and the creative choices we make! God is not boring and stuck. God is exciting and engaging. Jesus Christ is risen from the dead! Find a way to trust that this is true and live.

When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. - Jn 20:6-8
