Padre's Ponderings

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you for wearing red to Mass this weekend! You'll match the red flags on the parish lawn, each one representing a member of our parish community. You'll also notice the flags of the nations surrounding us as an assembly, reminding us of the global scope of the Church's mission. These are just a few (but visually arresting) signs by which we mark the birthday of the Church this Pentecost weekend! Just as the Holy Spirit appeared as tongues of fire over the Apostles gathered in prayer in the Upper Room, we pray that the Holy Spirit will be poured out upon us as we continue to strive, with the help of God's grace, to fulfill our mission as a parish community. This weekend, we will kick off Vision Season 2022, a time set aside to reflect on the elements of a shared vision to guide our efforts. These ten elements, which were first introduced during Vision Weekend 2021, will continue to shape and direct our priorities, our ministries, and our resources. In the coming weeks, be prepared to be reminded of them again. As a community, we can envision a parish at SMB that is:

missional, not preferential...

global in perspective...

a joy to participate in, not an obligation...

prioritizing vibrant worship... committed to fostering a culture of conversion...

actively investing in youth and families...

generously serving the poor...

financially stable, and not living hand-to-mouth...

⇒ a true community where members belong not merely to a database but to each other...

⇒ focused on growth-mode, not fix-it mode...

Don't worry if you can't remember the exact context for each; we hope to be able to unpack these elements of a shared vision in different ways in the coming weeks and months. But for now, know that without a shared vision, our parish will not be able to continue to grow and flourish.

I'll have some practical updates for you next week, but for now, please plan on joining us this coming Wednesday for an experience of prayer and reflection on the mission of the church, "The Church Alive," at 7pm. We'll explore those elements of a shared vision in a prayerful setting with music in relationship to the gifts of the Holy Spirit. As always, our music ministers have prepared a celebration that will raise our hearts and minds in prayer to the Holy Spirit, but will also challenge us to recommit ourselves to accept the commission to share the Gospel in our community and beyond. And the following Wednesday, June 15, at 7pm, we'll gather again for "Become What You Receive," an experience of Eucharistic Adoration with contemporary Praise and Worship music as we hear again the challenge to not only adore the Lord's Body present in the Eucharist, but through our worthy reception of it, to actually become his hands, his feet, his eyes in the world. Welcome to Vision Season 2022! I know the Lord has great things in store for SMB!





A Joyful Message



I remember the first time I cooked a full meal for my family. I was 20-yrs-old, and I had been married for all of three weeks. It was my father's birthday, and it seemed the perfect time to bring my parents and my in-laws together at our house for a home-cooked celebration. I was eager to try out my culinary skills for the six of us...everything would be made from scratch.

I made a roast beef with gravy, using whole wheat flour to thicken the gravy. (This was a mistake-do NOT use whole wheat flour when making gravy!) Beyond that one blatant error, everything else came out fairly well, from the mashed potatoes and roasted carrots to the chocolate cake with buttercream frosting. As we lingered over coffee, scraping the last of the cake crumbs from our plates, the conversation was steady and natural, and I was relieved to have pulled off my first attempt at cooking. Sitting together at that kitchen table, I came to understand that our sense of family had become real in the sharing of our food. As we clinked our wine glasses in unison, or passed the basket of bread, we'd bonded as a family unit...to be repeated many times over in the years to come, strengthening our ties in the process.

I ponder this memory now, as I watch our parishioners come forward to receive communion during Mass. A Eucharistic meal has been prepared for us, and we each share in that meal as we receive Christ's true presence in this sacrament. It is the sharing of this sacred meal that creates a sense of family for all of us. We bond together as a parish family unit, to be repeated many times over in the

years to come, strengthening our ties in the process.

In our second reading of today, St Paul continues with this theme, this reality, explaining how we all have different gifts, and different forms of service, and yet we all share of the same Spirit. Bonding these gifts and services together, "we are one body in this one Lord." It's pretty easy to appreciate how those words have come to life for us at St. Mary of the Bay...how our community continues to grow through the generous sharing of gifts: our gifts of time, our gifts of service, our gifts of enthusiasm and creativity that do indeed create one body, and one family in Christ.

Let's rejoice in all of that as we celebrate Pentecost Sunday today. Pentecost has been called "the birthday of the Church". It's a very happy birthday to us, as we continue to share our God-given gifts with one another and for one another. We all belong here together...and together is a wonderful place to be!
