† From the Desk of Father Tom †

Dear Friends,

With all that has been happening these past few weeks as we come back closer to "normal" (whatever that is!), there is also much happening behind the scenes, and I thought it would be good to update everyone on at least one of these projects.

Last year, just as the virus was hitting, we were about to make a formal dedication of our Emergency Power Supply, which was donated to us by several families, both in memory of loved ones and as a direct support to the parish. Our reliance on power to allow us to function as we would like led us to make this improvement, and we are so grateful for those who have supported this work. Our Welcome Center really can fulfill its name by always being available, rain or shine (or snow and ice!), to be a place of hospitality for our parish family.

With that project finished it caused us to consider the usual annual costs for our electricity. We had already converted our lighting to LED bulbs, and taken other cost-saving measures as reasonable. This led us to think about solar panels. Our Welcome Center roof is a vast, flat space, pretty well oriented to allow for such a use. Our research agreed with our thoughts, and the technology has developed to make such a project feasible, and good for us on along-term basis.

So, with the advice of our Parish Finance Committee, we have begun the process of installing these panels, which should provide an immense reduction in our having to purchase

power. The details of how this will work are rather extensive (and I am only too glad to bore those who like this stuff in person), but the bottom line is that it will be of great benefit to the parish over the next 25 years, at least.

It is, however, not an inexpensive proposition, totaling around \$120,000.00 dollars to install, which we can forecast will be paid back in about 8 years, from which point all the benefits will continue to accrue to the parish, reducing our costs for at least 25 years into the future. We will be funding this from our Diocesan Depository account for now, but something as beneficial to the parish should also be offered to the parish as a way to memorialize loved ones and secure the future of the parish.

With that said, I am open to receiving gifts to defray these costs and restore the balance to our Diocesan account, so as to allow for other future plans. As with the Emergency Power Supply, an engraved plaque noting the donors and their loved ones will be displayed prominently. From time to time people ask me if there is something that can be done in honor of their loved ones, or just to assist the parish, and I think this is something that can answer these questions. Please consider being a part of this wonderful work, and please pray that our plans come to full fruition for us as a parish, and to show our continued gratitude to God for all He has already given us.

May God continue to bless us as we continue moving from a time of some darkness to the full light of His beloved children.



GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

June 13, 2021 - 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A favorite motto of St. Teresa of Calcutta was, "do small things with great love." This is how it works in the kingdom of God. God can do tremendous things with the smallest gesture, especially when it is done in love. We can clearly see that our world is suffering greatly. People are struggling to find peace, navigate through conflicts, earn a sustainable living, find security and enough food to eat, and work through political tensions and conflicts. In the light of the magnitude of the difficulties that exist around us and even within us, we can find ourselves floundering to discover practical, effective solutions. How can something so large be helped by someone as small and seemingly insignificant as me? While whole systems and structures may be out of the league of our personal influence, are we really that helpless in the midst of all of the turmoil, sadness, and suffering?



If we believe that God is with us and that God is still working to bring about the glory of God's kingdom, then the answer is no. We are never helpless or without hope. Armed with a strong life of prayer, we can always flee to God and ask for inspiration, wisdom, and especially love. We are all blessed with unique gifts and talents and it often seems that considering all that the world lacks, love and charity remain at the top of the list. Life can easily become a battleground of hostility. Because life is challenging and difficult, anger is not far away. We see it on people's faces and hear

it in their voices. There is a measure of frustration that permeates all avenues of life. It is even felt in the air.

As people of faith, we know that what we see here is not the end but only a part of something far greater to come. We know that God's kingdom is where we are ultimately meant to be, and the Gospel is the way to get there. If love and charity can prevail in us, then God will be able to do what God does best. God will use us to scatter the seeds of his kingdom. Through our small gestures, those seeds can receive the nurturing attention that is necessary for them to bear great fruit. We cannot fall victim to the strife that is around us. We have to keep ourselves refreshed and focused so that even in small ways, we can become part of the solution, not the problem. Love and charity, which come from God, can help to heal the ills of the world. May we bring these simple gifts to the everyday simple tasks of our lives! Watch how big the plant grows!

Monday, June 14, 2021

Make an offering

It is fitting that today is both Flag Day in the United States and World Blood Donor Day. Many have shed their blood for the ideals a flag represents, and while most of us are not called to make the ultimate sacrifice for our country, many of us can make the small sacrifice of donating blood to save the lives of others. In some areas, the blood supply has become low because of fewer blood donations during the pandemic, and blood donation remains essential everywhere. If you are able to donate, or be supportive of someone who can, it will contribute to our much-needed healing in these hurting times.

Tuesday, June 15, 2021

With respect to elders

It's World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. Pope Francis marked the observance last year by describing a shameful and painfully obvious truth: "The COVID-19 pandemic has shown that our societies are not organized well enough to make room for the elderly, with proper respect for their dignity and frailty. When the elderly are not cared for, there is no future for the young." Eighty percent of COVID deaths have been people 65 or older. What does your parish or local community do to support and engage seniors? If programs are not in place, can you help initiate them?

Wednesday, June 16, 2021

Be well intentioned

Jesus' admonition to perform good deeds in private and pray alone in our rooms can be difficult to figure out when we belong to a church that calls the community's public gathering for Mass the "source and summit of faith." So here's the deal: Jesus isn't telling us to hide our faith but instead to check out why we do what we do. He frowns on giving alms to get attention or making a big public display of our prayer, as if to prove we are closer to God than our neighbor. Instead, we are called to pray, fast, and give alms simply to draw closer to our Lord. In public or private, let's pray with the best of intentions.

Thursday, June 17, 2021

Time to move beyond temptation

The Lord's Prayer, introduced in today's gospel, is the best-known Christian prayer the world over. Two years ago, a change in the way French Catholics say the prayer made headlines. The new translation avoids "lead us not into temptation" in favor of "do not let us fall into temptation." The point is that God doesn't lead us to sin. Rather, God gives us the strength to resist it, overcome it, learn from it, move beyond it. The next time you pray the great prayer, picture the Creator extending a hand to pull you away from sin into grace and light.

Get some rest

Saint Augustine of Hippo captures the human condition perfectly when he says in his Confessions: "Lord, . . . our heart is restless until it rests in you." Christian prayer practices are designed to protect us from spirit-dulling anxiety and bring us to the peace of Christ. Try meditating on these words from Saint Francis de Sales for starters: "The same Eternal Father who cares for you today will take good care of you tomorrow and every day of your life. Either he will shield you from suffering, or he will give you the unfailing strength to bear it. Be at peace then and put aside all useless thoughts, vain dreads, and anxious imaginations."

MEMORIAL OF ROMUALD, ABBOT

A simple practice for inner peace

Romuald was a 10th-century Italian monk and teacher. He started life as a wealthy aristocrat but soon found his life of pursuing comfort and pleasure unsatisfying. He sought refuge in a monastery and discovered peace as a monk. Wishing to help others achieve fulfillment, he founded the Camaldolese Order of monks and established several monasteries, instructing the monks to practice intellectual stillness and interior receptivity in meditation. "Take every opportunity you can to sing the Psalms in your heart," he wrote in his rule, "and to understand them with your mind." Take a moment today and give it a try.
