St. John's and St. Cecilia's Collaborative

Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests January 20 at 7PM

On the third Thursday of every month at 7PM in the lower chapel, we will be offering a Holy Hour for the Sanctification of Priests. This is something recommended by the Congregation of the Clergy and, in this our day and age, sorely needed. This secular age of ours presents some unique challenges to the Church and to Her ministerial priesthood. The current priest shortage adds to the stress that many priests feel and can be a challenge to their spiritual life and pastoral service. Thursday of Holy Week our Lord instituted the Holy Eucharist and priesthood, it is an ideal day to pray for priests before the Blessed Sacrament. The Holy Hour will consist of: adoration; the rosary; litany and prayer of petitions; silent prayer and benediction. "During that month I met with many holy Priests, and yet I saw that even though the sublime dignity of Priesthood raises them higher than the Angels, they are still but weak and imperfect men. If holy Priests, whom Our Lord in the Gospel calls the salt of the earth, have need of our prayers, how much more the struggling and the lukewarm?"

CROSS ROADS By Deacon Tony

Isaiah 62: 1-5; Psalm 96: 1-3, 7-10; 1 Corinthians 12: 4-11; John 2: 1-11

We, the Church are at the beginning of a new liturgical year. Being the "C" year, we will be hearing mostly Luke's gospel, except on special occasions, Lent, and Advent. But today we have listened to John's gospel, the only gospel that tells of the wedding feast at Cana. Today we see Jesus on the threshold of his public ministry. He already has selected disciples and is at a family wedding feast with his mother, and with his disciples who also were invited. Though his Hour has not yet come (his death and resurrection when the fullness of his glory is revealed), when the wine runs short Mary tells Jesus that they have no wine. Though Jesus is somewhat reluctant, Mary tells the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." In obedience to his mother, and for the sake of beginning to reveal his glory to his disciples, Jesus tells the servers to pour water into six large stone water jugs, each able to hold twenty to thirty gallons. Miraculously the water is transformed into the best of wines, better than the wine which ran short.

Symbolically, don't we all run out of wine from time to time? That is, in our weakness, don't we all run short of energy, strength, motivation due to discouragement, illness, injury, responsibilities, emergencies, sadness and such? What should we do? We should pray. Respectfully, reverently, humbly, and hopefully give glory to the Lord for all he has done for us. Seek the intercession of the Blessed Mother. He will give us what we need to be rejuvenated. But there is a caveat. We must follow the instructions of the Mother of God, "Do whatever he tells you." He tells us to repent, to partake of his body and blood, to love God with all our hearts, mind, and strength, to keep his commandments, and to love one another sacrificially as he does. Like the water that was transformed into the best of wines, we too can be transformed by his grace into something better than we were before.
