#### **DIVINE MERCY AND PURGATORY**



# St. John the Evangelist George R. Carlino Scholarships

These scholarships are made available through the late Mr. George R. Carlino, who was a very prayerful and devout parishioner of St. John's. #### **CROSS ROADS**



Acts 4: 8-12; Psalm 118: 1, 8-9, 21-23, 26, 28-29; 1 John 3: 1-2; John 10: 11-18

In today's first reading from Acts, Saint Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, proclaims to the leaders of the people that Jesus Christ, the stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone. Peter stated that if he and others were being questioned because of a good deed done for a cripple, Peter proclaimed that the cripple was healed in the name of Jesus Christ who rose from the dead. Peter further proclaimed that only through the Lord Jesus Christ can there be salvation.

Jesus is the cornerstone of the universal Catholic Church through which, and through whom the Father showers his love upon us, that we may be called children of God, and brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ. In today's gospel Jesus proclaims that he is the good shepherd who has the power to give up his life, and to take it up again for us (his sheep) for the forgiveness of sins. Christ proclaims that he has other sheep to tend. He welcomes all humanity, and leads all of us into one flock, the Church.

Jesus opened the door of salvation to all. He mingled with sinners, tax collectors, and forgave sins. But that inclusiveness and respect of one's conscience should not be mistaken for tolerance or enabling of sinful behavior. Rather, it is an invitation to being righteous. There must be sincere repentance, a commitment to live and love as Christ did, for us to receive forgiveness and salvation, and to be true members of the one flock. As for conscience, as we are thinking creatures of God, it is our responsibility to rightly form and conform our consciences to the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Like sheep, in our weakness we need our Good Shepherd to lead us. The Good Shepherd knows us. But for us to know Him and HIS voice we must go beyond our inclinations and wishes and be willing to be transformed to be more like him if we want to find real peace amid all the turmoil, challenges, and corruption of this world. The salutation, Shalom, means peace. When uttered twice, "Shalom Shalom," as Christ seemed to do when appearing in the locked upper room, it can mean "perfect peace." That is what Christ wants for us. As one flock, let us follow and be transformed by our Good Shepherd. Sha-Iom Shalom!
