

SHEPHERD'S CORNER



HAPPY, HOLY, HEALTHY, AND MAKING A DIFFERENCE! As we close out 2021 – another year of challenge in the midst of pandemic and so many other things going on all around us – we place our hopes on this new year of 2022; that things will at last get better. As we begin a new year, I don't want to talk about "resolutions"

because these can often be so superficial – lose some weight, exercise more, etc. Instead, we know that 2022 demands from us all something so much greater than shedding a few pounds. So, let us all pledge to set some serious and holy goals as we enter into this new year. Let us pledge to work on being happy, holy, healthy, and making a real difference in our world.

Happy. This is such an important one in no small part because we live in such a divisive time. We know that the divisiveness in our world rages at a fever pitch. I think we all need to set a goal to reject that negativity, and make a different choice – a choice to be happy. I, for one, choose to be happy. It is much less stressful, and can actually become contagious to those around you. Choose to be happy each day, and share that happiness with those around you.

Holy. Now when I say making holiness a goal, I don't mean becoming "holier-than-thou." This is not a self-righteousness, but rather a movement towards God. It means being holier-than-yesterday, recognizing that our holiness is a journey that leads us into greater union with God. But, it needs to be intentional. How will I pray more today? How will I be more like Jesus today? How will I grow in holiness today? Ask those questions every day and take the steps that the answers suggest. By the way, this one will also contribute to the last one. When you strive for holiness, it leads to greater happiness.

Healthy. Sickness and death defined so much of the last two years. We need 2022 to be a year defined by a return to health. Our bodies, after all, are living temples of the Holy Spirit. So, let's take those words seriously and treat our temple as the home for God's indwelling that it is. Again, this isn't about fad diets, and exercise regiments that won't last, but day-by-day choices for health. Can I walk a bit more today, can I think about my health and the choices I make every day to be stronger? Can I wear my mask, wash my hands, get my vaccination, and help others stay safe and healthy too? These all make me a better temple, and more able to be a servant of the Lord.

Making a Difference. All of these things lead us to be agents of change in our world. When we are happy, holy, and healthy, we are more able to be the change that our world so desperately needs. Has someone's life been made better, easier, comforted, changed because of my presence in it? How can I be a presence that is reconciling, compassionate, helpful, and joyful? These small daily things will make a difference in our lives and in our world.

So, let's not throw our hands in the air and decide that 2022 I already a loss, let's turn it around and make this a year to remember for all the right reasons.

Let me end with a few lines of verse from Alfred Lord Tennyson. This one called, *Ring out, wild bells*:

Ring out, wild bells, to the wild sky, The flying cloud, the frosty light: The year is dying in the night; Ring out, wild bells, and let him die.

Ring out the old, ring in the new, Ring, happy bells, across the snow: The year is going, let him go; Ring out the false, ring in the true.

Ring out the grief that saps the mind For those that here we see no more; Ring out the feud of rich and poor, Ring in redress to all mankind.

Ring out a slowly dying cause, And ancient forms of party strife; Ring in the nobler modes of life, With sweeter manners, purer laws.

Ring out the want, the care, the sin, The faithless coldness of the times; Ring out, ring out my mournful rhymes But ring the fuller minstrel in.

Ring out false pride in place and blood, The civic slander and the spite; Ring in the love of truth and right, Ring in the common love of good.

Ring out old shapes of foul disease; Ring out the narrowing lust of gold; Ring out the thousand wars of old, Ring in the thousand years of peace.

Ring in the valiant man and free, The larger heart, the kindlier hand; Ring out the darkness of the land, Ring in the Christ that is to be.

The Epiphany of the Lord



In his Apostolic Exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis references a thought from Pope Benedict XVI: "Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the en-

counter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." Today we celebrate an encounter with the Person of Jesus Christ! This simple but holy event in time dramatically changes human life, pointing it toward a new horizon and giving it a decisive direction. This is a message and truth that is not meant to be shared with only a select few who qualify but with the entire world. Pope Francis continues saying, "Thanks solely to this encounter or renewed encounter with God's love, which blossoms into an enriching friendship, we are liberated from our narrowness and self-absorption. We become fully human when we become more than human, when we let God bring us beyond ourselves in order to attain the fullest truth of our being."

Look around at people. Where is life heading for them? What gives them direction? Even we who are people of faith can get distracted and lose our focus. God, in all of His fullness, is revealed in Jesus Christ and we can encounter Him! God is tangible, real, vulnerable, poor, and full of wonders, surprises, and opportunities. For those who are struggling and lost, today is a day of great joy. All they have to do is reach out and touch the truth of Christ. This presence is revealed in the poor, exploited, and vulnerable ones who cry out for compassion and love. But it is also found in the faithful ones who see in the Epiphany of God a liberation from structures and systems that hurt us, a narrowness of mind and heart that constricts us, and an absorption in our self-agenda that prevents us from seeing anything other than ourselves as important.

We have been given the charge of preaching this Good News. If only we could find a way to be more effective, it might stand a chance of doing what God intended it to do. There is always tomorrow and our memory of that bright new light that shone so brilliantly that Bethlehem night pointing us to truth and reminding us that we are loved. ©LPi

It is not enough to know that Jesus was born, like Herod, if we do not encounter him...Today we are asked to imitate the Magi. They do not debate; they set out. They do not stop to look, but enter the



house of Jesus. They do not put themselves at the center, but bow down before the One who is the center. They do not remain glued to their plans, but are prepared to take other routes. Their actions reveal a close contact with the Lord, a radical openness to him, a total engagement with him. With him, they use the language of love, the same language that Jesus, though an infant, already speaks. Indeed, the Magi go to the Lord not to receive, but to give. Let us ask ourselves this question: at Christmas did we bring gifts to Jesus for his party, or did we only exchange gifts among ourselves? ~Pope Francis, Homily, Solemnity of the Epiphany, 2018

For all Christians on this Solemnity of the Epiphany; may we follow the example of the Three Kings by seeking God and serving him and his people, especially the poor and vulnerable.






