Next Sunday, the obligation to attend Mass returns. We're shifting from "It's nice to be here" to "I gotta go." Let's think about what obligation means—the "why" of the "have to."

Start with Jesus. He got us into this in the first place, after all. He said at the Last Supper "Do this in memory of Me." Not read the book. Not take a quiet meditative walk. Not know stuff about religion. But, "Do this" "Take and eat." Throughout the Bread of Life discourse we've heard Him tell us that the Eucharist gives us eternal life.

Don't forget His apostles. Jesus gave His apostles authority. "What you declare loosed or bound on earth will be loosed or bound in heaven." The Church, a loving mother and teacher, continues to exercise that authority for our good. The Church knows we can't live without the Bread of Heaven.

Someone deserves this. And that someone isn't you or me. Every breath we take, every talent we have, every accomplishment, every moment of forgiveness, every surge of strength in adversity is a gift from God. The Mass is a sacrifice we offer to God, because "It is right and just." From the Church's earliest days we've called our liturgy Eucharist—"Thanksgiving."


Witness. None of us can make this Christian journey alone. We need the witness and support of others. We come to Mass to give that witness. We come to Mass to offer that support. We come to Mass to tell every member of the congregation: "You're not the only one!" We come to Mass to tell our community: "We're in this building because we believe in Jesus Christ, the Savior of the world!" We gather on Sundays to say: "He is risen!"

Real Presence. The servant of God, Dorothy Day tells about a man who was part of the Catholic Worker movement committed to living simply and serving the poor. He was an atheist, but filled with admi-

ration for the compassion that these Catholics showed to the least of the brethren. He often said "If I believed what Catholics believe about the Eucharist, nothing would keep me away from Mass!" In the end, on his death bed, he was baptized and received that Real Presence. Never forget what a treasure this Sacrament is!

Source and Summit. Often I hear folks comment that Vatican II did away with things traditional music, the Latin language, the pope's authority, etc. Sometimes we seem to think that Vatican II erased old fashioned ideas like obligation. It did not. In fact, the flagship description of the Eucharist—"source and summit of the Christian life" really ramps it up. We derive the strength to live our Christian life from our participation at Mass. The high point of our Christian life comes when we offer this sacrifice in union with Christ, in His Spirit, to the Father.

One thing I hoped we learned during COVID. If you're sick (or when you're obliged to care for a sick person), the obligation was never there! Stay at home. Recuperate. Don't spread the sickness.

PARISH REGISTRATION & MEMBERSHIP

All Catholics should be officially enrolled in a parish. To become members of Church of the Resurrection you are asked to register with the Office Administrator. There are also registration forms available in the narthex of the church. Also, please notify the office of any address and/or telephone number changes.

VOLUNTEERS

Church of the Resurrection can always use new altar servers, ushers, choir and contemporary group singers, cantors, and instrumentalists. CHRISTIAN MARRIAGE

Church law requires Catholics to be married with the church's prayers and blessings. Please call the pastor at least six months before your anticipated wedding date. All couples must complete a Pre-Cana program. If you or your fiancée were previously married and divorced, you will need an annulment before being married in the church. Allow at least a year to finish the annulment process.

BAPTISM

Infants and small children may be baptized at any Saturday evening or Sunday morning celebration of the Eucharist outside of Lent. The parish baptismal preparation session is required before the baptism of a couple's first child. Please find request form on our website.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Please notify the parish office whenever anyone is sick, unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Holy Communion. Eucharistic Ministers are available to bring Communion to the sick. The Pastor will bring the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick as needed.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

Sundays, September to May, K-8 at 9:30am. High School Students / Youth Group have various activities that can be found on the church website or within this bulletin. A two-year period of preparation for First Penance and First Eucharist takes place in first and second grades for baptized children. A two-year program of Confirmation preparation for children who have received Baptism and Eucharist takes place during the seventh and eighth grades. All children must be registered.
