CHARITY & DONATIONS

Expectations Women's Center

There are two local Expectations Women's Centers in our area that provide education and resources for women to make good choices. There is a basket in the Narthex for you to leave

any donated items such as diapers, toiletries, bibs, wipes and any item needed by an expectant mom.

Family Promise

The Family Promise organization is in need of personal hygiene products and cleaning supplies. They will also take monetary donations. There is a basket in the Narthex to leave your donation.

Shepherd of the Streets

The Shepherd of the Streets organization is always in great need for personal hygiene products. They can also use home items such as bath towels, wash cloths, sheets, and blankets, etc.

Son Light House

The Son Light House organization is in need of dry and canned goods. At this time they can only take non-perishable food items due to the pandemic. They also need clothing.

HandUp Clothing Bin

There is a bin for clothing and small miscellaneous items in the parking lot. If during these next few weeks you get around to that de-cluttering cleaning project, please bring your items over to the bin and deposit them for others in need.

School children quickly grow out of their clothes, especially, coats/jackets and you may even find that the summer clothes you saved for this year just do not fit. Stop by and drop them into the bin on your way to church.

Aluminum Collection

Your Resurrection Council, The Knights of Columbus continues to encourage recycling of your aluminum beverage cans. The bin located in the parking lot next to the dumpster can be used to deposit your empty aluminum beverage cans. All we ask is that you rinse them out prior to bringing them to the bin. Summer (any warm weather in general) is a tough time with bees and rodents being attracted to soft-drink or beer cans that still have some of that sweet stuff in them.

The easiest thing might be to collect your beverage cans at home and put them into a clean trash bag or plastic shopping bag. When that fills up at your home, just bring it to church and drop the bag into the bin.

WHAT TO AVOID DEPOSITING: Please DO NOT deposit tin (bimetal) cans (canned foods, pet food, coffee cans, etc) or aluminum pet food cans. Also, aluminum pie pans, foil and canned meat containers (e.g. "spam) are not accepted at the recycling center.

The bin is emptied as needed by K of C members who have volunteered to transport the cans to the recycling center.

PARISH REGISTRATION & MEMBERSHIP

All Catholics should be officially enrolled in a parish. To become members of Church of the Resurrection you are asked to register with the Office Administrator. There are also registration forms available in the narthex of the church. Also, please notify the office of any address and/or telephone number changes.

Church of the Resurrection can always use new altar servers, ushers, choir and contemporary group singers, cantors, and instrumentalists. CHRISTIAN MARRIAGE

Church law requires Catholics to be married with the church's prayers and blessings. Please call the pastor at least six months before your anticipated wedding date. All couples must complete a Pre-Cana program. If you or your fiancée were previously married and divorced, you will need an annulment before being married in the church. Allow at least a year to finish the annulment process.

BAPTISM

Infants and small children may be baptized at any Saturday evening or Sunday morning celebration of the Eucharist outside of Lent. The parish baptismal preparation session is required before the baptism of a couple's first child. Please find request form on our website

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Please notify the parish office whenever anyone is sick, unable to attend Mass and wishes to receive Holy Communion. Eucharistic Ministers are available to bring Communion to the sick. The Pastor will bring the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick as needed.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAM

Sundays, September to May, K-8 at 9:30am. High School Students / Youth Group have various activities that can be found on the church website or within this bulletin. A two-year period of preparation for First Penance and First Eucharist takes place in first and second grades for baptized children. A two-year program of Confirmation preparation for children who have received Baptism and Eucharist takes place during the seventh and eighth grades. All children must be registered.
