



### **VANITY**

"Vanity of vanities, says Qoheleth, vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!"

It seems that from the beginning, the key word in the book of Ecclesiastes is *vanity*. This book has been accused of being a killjoy or religious pessimist. For today's world anything written in the negative is looked upon as illnatured and offensive. Perhaps that's why so many people today know so little about Ecclesiastes. Contrary to popular opinion, the negative tone of Ecclesiastes is driving us to discover true and lasting joy in God.

We live in а culture filled that with is meaninglessness. When we have a massively popular website dedicated to bouncing cats where people will go and waste precious minutes and hours of life, there has to be some meaningful message in life worthy of our time right? That is exactly what Solomon is trying to teach us. A life lived apart from God is vanity of vanities. It's like the pattern of the sun, the circuits of the wind, and the endless flowing streams – it seems meaningless.

Millions of people on planet Earth are starting off their Monday without hope in God. They are going through their morning routines and looking at their calendar which merely keeps them between the lines in this rat race of life. They search for meaning in the temporal successes of life, but once they achieve their goals, they realize it was merely temporal and then it's gone. 
