UPDATE FROM FATHER DANTE:

We recently heard from Father Dante. He was transferred to a parish in the Central Philippines and they were hit by Super Typhoon Rai in December:

"We don't have internet, we don't have electricity. We just recently hit by a super typhoon. A lot of people died. People lost their houses but we are resilient. I was already transferred to a parish last May 2021... I'm handling a parish now. Because of the typhoon, we are busy helping people build their houses and we also supply relief goods for them. There's a lot of work to do in my parish..."

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone.

“Where do I fit in all of this?” The question every adolescent, and some adults, ask themselves at some point in their lives. This is a question we should ask ourselves as faithful Catholics too, “where do I fit into the Church?” Or more appropriately, “where does God want me to fit into the church?” The beautiful thing is that the church is vast, with many places for all peoples of all gifts and talents to fit into, as he puts it *there are different forms of service but the same Lord.*

Where do you fit in? The majority are called to build households, domestic churches, where the faith flourishes and the next generation of Catholics are born. As Pope Paul VI says, “the family, like the Church, ought to be a place where the Gospel is transmitted and from which the Gospel radiates.” Yes, most people are called to sacramental married life, where via loving sacrifice man and woman become *one flesh*. This is a most beautiful calling and one which edifies the church. When the family is strong, the church is strong.

But not every “fits in” with this calling, this is why God creates some people to be nuns, friars, or monks; men and women called instead to live celibate lives, *for the sake of the kingdom of God*. Yes, some women have the privilege of being called by Our Lord to be the brides of no man here on earth, rather his own brides. This is why nuns wear the habit, as a perpetual wedding dress symbolizing their marriage to the one true bridegroom, Our Lord Jesus Christ. *The bridegroom is here, come out and welcome Him*. Men called to religious life on the other hand have the church as their bride, *a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless*.

Then there are those men called to be *alter cristus*, other Christs here on earth, in service of all. These men are called to live as Christ did and do what Christ did while He walked among us. Every sacrament that the priest celebrates is precisely this, the work done by Our Lord Himself; forgiving sins and healing the sick. This is a most demanding calling as St John Vianney states, “A priest goes to Heaven or a priest goes to Hell with a thousand souls behind him.” Therefore a priest must live for the sanctification of his neighbors.

2ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Hay diferentes tipos de dones espirituales pero el mismo Espíritu; hay diferentes formas de servicio pero el mismo Señor; hay diferentes obras pero el mismo Dios que las produce todas en todos.

"¿Dónde encajo yo en todo esto?" La pregunta que todo adolescente, y algunos adultos, se hacen en algún momento de su vida. Esta es una pregunta que también deberíamos hacernos como fieles católicos: "¿Dónde encajo yo en la Iglesia?" O más apropiadamente, "¿dónde quiere Dios que yo encaje en la iglesia?" Lo hermoso es que la iglesia es vasta, con muchos lugares para que encajen todas las personas de todos los dones y talentos, como dice San Pablo, *hay diferentes formas de servicio pero el mismo Señor.*

¿Dónde encaja usted? La mayoría está llamada a construir hogares, iglesias domésticas, donde florezca la fe y nazca la próxima generación de católicos. Como dice el Papa Pablo VI, "la familia, como la Iglesia, debe ser un lugar donde se transmita el Evangelio y desde donde se irradia el Evangelio". Sí, la mayoría de las personas están llamadas a la vida matrimonial sacramental, donde a través del sacrificio amoroso el hombre y la mujer se vuelven *una sola carne*. Este es un llamado muy hermoso y que edifica a la iglesia. Cuando la familia es fuerte, la iglesia es fuerte.

Pero no todos "encajan" con esta vocación, por eso Dios crea a algunas personas para que sean monjas, frailes o monjes; hombres y mujeres llamados en cambio a vivir vidas célibes, por el bien del reino de Dios. Sí, algunas mujeres tienen el privilegio de ser llamadas por Nuestro Señor para ser esposas de ningún hombre aquí en la tierra, sino sus propias esposas. Es por eso que las monjas usan el hábito, como un vestido de novia perpetuo que simboliza su matrimonio con el único y verdadero esposo, Nuestro Señor Jesucristo. *El novio está aquí, sal y dale la bienvenida.* Los hombres llamados a la vida religiosa en cambio tienen a la Iglesia por esposa, *una Iglesia radiante, sin mancha ni arruga ni ninguna otra mancha, pero santa e intachable.*

Luego están aquellos hombres llamados a ser *alter cristus*, otros Cristos aquí en la tierra, al servicio de todos. Estos hombres están llamados a vivir como lo hizo Cristo y hacer lo que Cristo hizo mientras caminaba entre nosotros. Cada sacramento que celebra el sacerdote es precisamente esto, obra realizada por el mismo Nuestro Señor; perdonando los pecados y curando a los enfermos. Este es un llamamiento muy exigente, como dice San Juan Vianney, "Un sacerdote va al cielo o un sacerdote va al infierno con mil almas detrás de él". Por lo tanto, el sacerdote debe vivir para la santificación de sus vecinos.
