I hope and pray that these days of Christmas will give you time to enjoy the blessings of family and friends and savor the goodness of life. These precious moments together around the holidays are often hardfought, but they are worth all our efforts. Third graders at a retreat one year made this very clear to me. Before spending some time praying in the Blessed Sacrament chapel, I would meet with each small group for a little conversation to prepare them. Talking about how close to us Jesus would be in just a few moments, I asked "When have you felt closest to God?" After a little reflection, many of the children came back with the answer: "Home with my family spending time during Christmas." What really surprised me was that a bunch of them (unprompted and in separate groups), also said that they felt closest to God while at Mass in quiet prayer after they had received Holy Communion. That's a good way to get a priest all choked up.

How beautiful and moving it is when the abstract knowledge that Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us," becomes a real experience of his presence. I'm not talking about a mere emotional feeling, but a human experience that involves the whole person: mind and body, heart and soul. An experience that even a whole litany of words - awe, wonder, love, intimacy, tenderness, acceptance, light-heartedness, exhilaration, warmth, affection, joy, peace - falls far short of describing.

The experience of Emmanuel, "God with us," is a gift that we are given in certain moments throughout our lives to heal us, strengthen us, and guide us. Not every moment or every day, not even every month or year. But at different moments in life we are given glimpses of what it is like to be close to God. These moments are meant to whet our appetite for heaven and strengthen us along our journey. Our hearts are restless, St. Augustine said, until they rest in Christ. We are made to be close to God, to dwell with him – first in this world in partial and mysterious ways, and finally at the end of time in complete and unending love.

My hope and prayer is that this Christmas will be for you an experience of the closeness of Christ as you spend time together with loved ones in your earthly homes and in the spiritual homes of our parish churches. Merry Christmas!


