SACRAMENTS



WORSHIP

TODAY IS THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Today we continue our celebration of Christmas as the church celebrates the Epiphany of the Lord. The word *Epiphany* means "appearance," "revelation" and "manifestation." On this day we contemplate the mystery of God who revealed himself as a tiny child and yet who is the "Light of the World." This Epiphany is one of the most ancient feasts of the Christian calendar. In the Eastern Orthodox churches and in many parts of the Middle East and Eastern Europe it is celebrated with greater festivity than Christmas. The Magi described in today's gospel were astrologers. They observed an unusual astronomical phenomenon and were seeking out the meaning of the event. They journeyed for a newborn "king" they did not yet know. They were open to where the journey might lead. Eventually, they discovered the Savior.

The story is very much about our life's journey and our faith, God's manifestation of himself to us, and our response through the sharing and offering of our gifts. As we begin 2022, we might reflect upon our life together as a parish during tumultuous times: "How has God been leading us over the past year? Where do we see the light of Christ shining in our parish community during this extraordinary year? How might we be called to open our treasures in 2022? What gifts are we being called to share? Has our "distancing led us to discover new insights and "treasures?"

The journey of the Magi is one we are all called to embrace. May the light of Christ beckon us to new discoveries into God's love along life's pilgrimage.


CONTINUING OUR CELEBRATION OF CHRISTMAS

Saint Augustine said that "God became human so that humans might become more like God."

What an amazing thing to say! But it goes right to the heart of what we celebrate during the Christmas season. Through the mystery of the Incarnation, we share in Christ because Christ shares in us-a marvelous exchange. It is our faith that this exchange continues. God becomes human so that humans might become more like God, right now. Today. Sometimes we hear people say that Christmas is Jesus' birthday. But this is only partly true. A birthday is a celebration of a past event. Christmas is the celebration of what is happening now. When we sing and pray, "Christ is born, today" we really mean it!
