

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY JANUARY 18-25, 2022

The Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity begins this Tuesday, January 18th. It is tragic that the Body of Christ remains divided. Sadly, just as there are divisions within families and within our nation, there are painful centuries-old divisions within the church. These divisions are contrary to the will of Christ who prayed that, "all would be one." When we encounter Christians of other traditions (Eastern Orthodox, Anglican and Protestant) we can be grateful for the extraordinary fullness of our Catholic tradition and at the same time marvel at the holiness and goodness of our non-Catholic brothers and sisters. This week we ask the Holy Spirit to help us to recognize Christ in one another. We pray for the courage to dialogue honestly and respectfully about what unites us and about what divides us.

PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS

inquiries about being a godparent for baptism

Occasionally, the parish office receives inquiries regarding the role of godparents and the request for "sponsor letters" for potential godparents. Hopefully the following information will be helpful: The role of a godparent is a wonderful privilege. It is a privilege for anyone sincerely seeking to nurture the faith of another. Godparents are not potential legal guardians for a child in the event of sickness or death. Rather, a godparent is a person chosen to assist in the Catholic upbringing of the person being baptized. A godparent makes a public profession of faith during the baptism liturgy and promises by word and example to assist in the faith formation of the individual being baptized. Many parishes request a Sponsor Letter attesting that the godparent is baptized, received First Communion, is confirmed, participates in the sacramental life of the parish to the best of the pastor's knowledge, and strives to faithfully live their Catholic faith. When a person lives in West Boylston or the immediate area and regularly participates in the sacramental life of the parish, we are usually able to provide the Sponsor Letter to the parish where the baptism is to take place. However, when a person has moved away from the area, taken up permanent residence elsewhere and no longer participates in the sacramental life of Our Lady of Good Counsel, we are unable to provide that letter. He or she would need to go to the parish in that area and approach the parish priest of that parish. We are always happy to provide any record of previous Baptism, First Communion or Confirmation that took place here at Our Lady of Good Counsel, if that is needed. Sample copies of Sponsor Letters are available in the parish office for anyone wishing to review a copy. It is our sincere hope that families will choose godparents who by their example will nurture the faith of the children entrusted to them!

PARISH PROPERTY UPDATE

40 Church Street property | January 10 update: The Diocese is in dialogue with the town regarding the required variances that will be needed for the sale of the property.

Parking lot church entrance door replacement | January 10th update: The work is complete.

Exterior Front church steps and walkway | January 10th update: The project has been approved by the Diocesan Building Commission. The contract with D.S. Landscaping has been signed. **Work is scheduled to begin this spring.** We need to be mindful that once the work is undertaken, we will not be able to use the front entrance for about two weeks, depending on the weather.


