

Hung comes from a parish of 3,000 parishioners, all of whom have a strong and active spiritual life. As a child, Hung attended daily Mass with his family, who provided strong examples of the Catholic life. His mother taught him how to read the Old Testament, New Testament and books about the Saints. He often served at Mass and hearing the homilies and teaching of the Pastor had a great impact on his desire to pursue a consecrated vocation to serve God and the Church.

In August of 2016, Hung entered St. John Seminary, and continues to enjoy his formation and the kindness of his classmates. Among his first studies was that of the English language. It was here that he met many friends from all over the world, who like him, did not know the language well. He is soon to enter his 2nd year of Theology.

Looking back at his life, namely his time in the United States, Hung says, "I can say God always loves me and guides me on His way." Regarding his daily journey to stay close to Jesus—and to do so well – he asks for our prayerful support as he spends this summer with us.



The Holy Rood Collaborative

The Holy Rood refers to any image of Mary, the mother of Jesus, and John, the favorite disciple, standing together at the foot of The Cross. Okay, but...



how does St. Margaret fit into this?

It is said that when 21-year-old Margaret had to flee to Scotland following the conquest of England in 1066, she brought her most valuable treasure with her... A true relic of the specific wooden cross upon which Christ was crucified and died. In 1070, her husband, Malcom III, founded the Abbey of Dunfermline, where she kept this relic enshrined in an ebony colored crucifix—this is how the term Black Rood came into being, to which it is often referred. In 1093, as she lay dying, it was this relic to which she clung.

Her great love and devotion of this relic inspired her son, King David I, the youngest of St. Margaret's children, to erect the Holy Rood Abbey in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1128. It was here that the relic continued to be safeguarded until it was regained by the English in 1346.

*From the
Pastor*



June 20th this year is an interesting date for me; it is both Father's Day and my mom's birthday. She turns 89. (I know generally we are not supposed to share ages but, at this point, I know my mom doesn't care.) My Dad taught us many lessons throughout the years, particularly when we were younger, about how we should conduct ourselves and how we should treat people. The most important lesson Dad taught us was how we should treat mom—that, at all times, she was/is to be treated with respect. However, my dad would actually put up with us showing *him* some level of disrespect under the right circumstances. He understood emotions could get in the way and circumstances could lead us to say things that we really should not say. He was willing to allow us some leeway. But he would *not* tolerate, for any reason, any level of disrespect when it came to his wife. It was the surest way of getting dad to get truly angry. Dad was always clear on this point no matter the circumstances: there was only one way to treat mom. We joke even today that if mom was shown disrespect from any of us, dad would come back from the grave and make it very clear that it was not acceptable.

There are many lessons we have learned from our parents that have remained with us during our lives. Some of them are very good but others could best be unlearned. One of the things I preach on with parents at baptisms is the important roles they have in the life of their child(ren). It is amazing the things that infants learn, how quickly they learn, and the way they learn. Children, in a relatively short amount of time, learn how to walk, speak and understand language, and eat. They manage to do all this simply by watching their parents. The role that parents play in the life of their kids is quite amazing. However, it is *not* so much what the parents say as what they do. The kids learn from watching their parents and imitating what they say and do. A classic example of this is when a child repeats one of the naughty words that parents do not want them saying. And the parents realize that the child learned the word from them.

In the case of my dad, he did not simply tell us we had to treat my mom with respect; he showed us by the respect he always showed my mom. He really supported my mom to be the person she is, even when at times it clearly drove him nuts. Dad really was a huge introvert and mom is a huge extrovert. For her, the more people, the merrier, but at times it felt like chaos being around her. Much of this worked simply because of who dad was. Nothing really got out of control if he was around. My dad's presence, in many ways, gave my mom the freedom to be true to

herself. For dad, this was simply put: he loved and respected my mom, which meant he had to allow her to be her true self.

It is an important lesson that I have tried to imitate in my own life. I do not have to agree with people's choices or decisions in life. I do not have to agree with their perspectives about life. I do not have to agree with what they hold to be important. I do not even need to agree with them as to what they believe truth is. However, even if I am not on the same page with them, I must still treat them with respect. I must give them the room to make the choices I disagree with. Relationships are *not* built on mutual agreement. Relationships are built upon trust, respect, and reciprocation. My parents taught me this important lesson in how they lived out their relationship.

As Christians we have a responsibility to teach others also, not so much by what we say but in how we live. As Saint Francis is reputed to have said, "Preach the Gospel, and when necessary, use words." The greatest tool we have for bringing the truth of the Gospels to others is by demonstrating it in our choices. The biggest hinderance to growing in our faith is for a Christian to choose to follow the culture of our times. The biggest blockage to our faith comes from those who give lip service to what it means to be Christian. They are willing to bear the name but not pay the price that the name entails.

One who is not willing to take up the cross each day is not worthy to follow Christ. One who is not willing to place God's will before all else is not worthy to follow Christ. One who is not willing to stand up for the faith is not worthy to follow Christ.

The good thing is that all of us at some point fall into the category of not being worthy to follow Christ, but Christ has provided the way back. He has given us the sacraments, the scriptures, and the Church as ways to help us receive the grace necessary to live the Christ-like life that we desire and need.

Therefore, let us learn from Christ the lessons we need, to live a life that will lead others to Christ. Let us learn from Christ how to live a life that can be truly imitated—one that will allow others to discover Christ through us.



The Eucharistic Miracle of Lanciano

I had the great blessing to visit and see this miracle on a couple of occasions—the first and greatest Eucharistic Miracle in the Church. This wondrous Event took place in the 8th century A.D. in the little Church of St. Legontian, as a divine response to a Basilian monk's doubt about Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist.

During Holy Mass, after the two-fold consecration, the host was changed into live Flesh and the wine was changed into live Blood, which coagulated into five globules, irregular and differing in shape and size.

The Host-Flesh, as can be very distinctly observed today, has the same dimensions as the large host used today in the Latin Church; it is light brown and appears rose-colored when lighted from the back.

The Blood is coagulated and has an earthy color resembling the yellow of ochre. Various ecclesiastical investigations—"Recognitions"—were conducted since 1574.

In 1970-71, and taken up again partly in 1981, there took place a scientific investigation by the most illustrious scientist Prof. Odoardo Linoli, eminent Professor in Anatomy and Pathological Histology and in Chemistry and Clinical Microscopy. He was assisted by Prof. Ruggero Bertelli of the University of Siena.

The analyses were conducted with absolute and unquestionable scientific precision, and they were documented with a series of microscopic photographs. These analyses sustained the following conclusions:

The Flesh is real Flesh. The Blood is real Blood. The Flesh and the Blood belong to the human species. The Flesh consists of the muscular tissue of the heart. In the Flesh we see present in section: the myocardium, the endocardium, the vagus nerve and also the left ventricle of the heart for the large thickness of the myocardium. The Flesh is a "HEART" complete in its essential structure. The Flesh and the Blood have the same blood-type: AB (Blood-type identical to that which Prof. Baima Bollone uncovered in the Holy Shroud of Turin). In the Blood there were found proteins in the same normal proportions—percentage-wise—as are found in the sero-proteic make-up of fresh normal blood. In the Blood there were also found these minerals: chlorides, phosphorus, magnesium, potassium, sodium and calcium. The preservation of the Flesh and of the Blood, which were left in their natural state for twelve centuries and exposed to the action of atmospheric and biological agents, remains an extraordinary phenomenon.

With Adoration beginning again, let us remember and never forget that we are in the presence of His Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Most Blessed Sacrament.
