

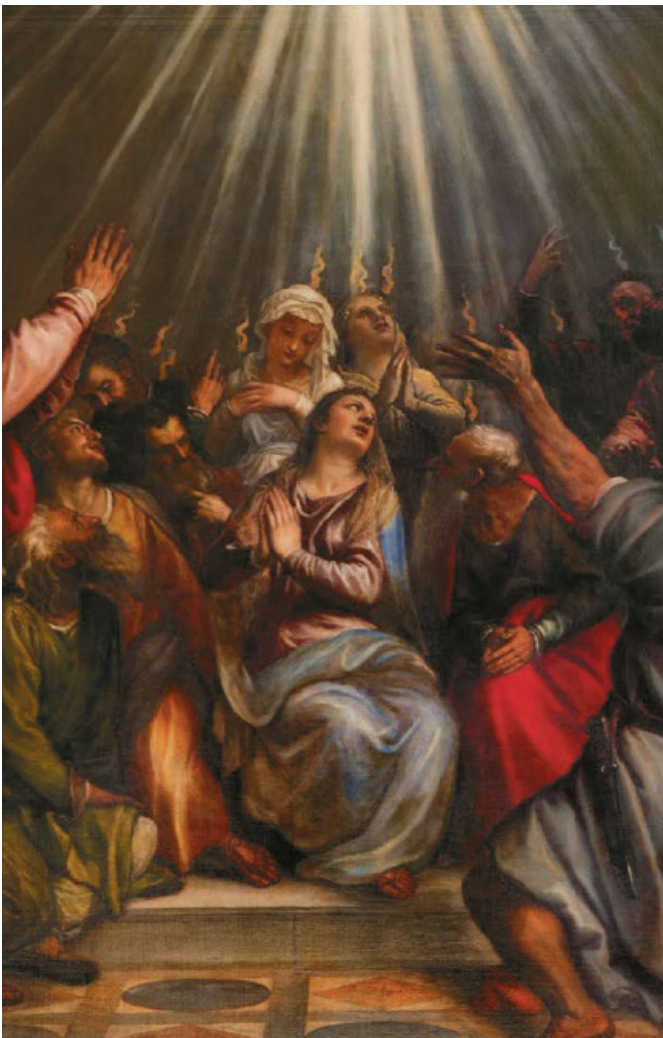

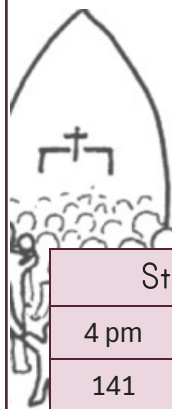

happy BIRTHDAY

We're all familiar with our own birthdays, and we celebrate them

because they mark the day of the year in which we entered into this life. But did you know you have a second birthday? Because you are part of the body of the Church, Pentecost is the Church's birthday, and yours as well. And like any birthday, it's a cause for celebration.

The word Pentecost is Greek and it means "50th day." Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their Earthly ministry to make disciples of all nations.

At Pentecost, the Apostles and their followers were gathered in a room. At this time, a great wind blew and a flame appeared as a tongue of fire, which split itself into many individual flames above the heads of all those present. The Holy Spirit came upon these people and each began to speak in tongues. Despite the fact many had no common language, they were perfectly able to understand one another. Others who were not so blessed, accused those speaking in tongues of being drunk, but Peter arose and addressed the crowd, explaining that it was only 9 o'clock, and that this phenomenon was not intoxication, but rather this was the work of the Holy Spirit, prophesied in the scripture. Peter then called all those present to be baptized and about three thousand people were baptized that day.

These people were among the first Catholics, and Peter is the first pope of the Catholic Church.

Sunday, June 2nd and Saturday, June 8th, some of these youth will be speaking at each of our Masses. One of the things they will address is our annual CHWC

Fundraising Campaign: Tools4Teens (back by popular demand)! Following is a full explanation of how this fundraiser works.

Beginning the weekend of June 1st/2nd, you will find images of toolboxes on the bulletin boards in each of our churches... 1 per camper. On each toolbox is a list of the tools needed to fill it; each assigned a donation amount. Our goal is to fill all toolboxes at each church! **PLEASE NOTE that this is JUST a metaphor—our teens do not need these tools in physical form**, but it is the monetary value assigned each tool that is needed to pay for their transportation to and from Delaware).

To make your donation, pick the tan envelope that has the picture of the tool you wish to 'purchase.' **PLEASE NOTE:** When you decide on a total donation amount, **please choose a tool or tools, that in combination, correspond with that amount.**

- for example: \$20 = measuring tape (\$20)
\$80 = paintbrush (\$50) + pliers (\$30)
\$150 = toolbox (\$100), hammer (\$40) + gloves (\$10)

In the envelope, you will find the directions as to how to make your donation.

In addition to financial support, we are also looking to support our campers with prayer. Each toolbox is also asking for 3 Rosaries—i.e. committing to prayer—which is at zero cost; it costs nothing to pray! When you choose the white Prayer envelope (indicated by a rosary), the name of the camper to pray for will be included. With or without a Prayer envelope, prayers are ALWAYS WELCOME!

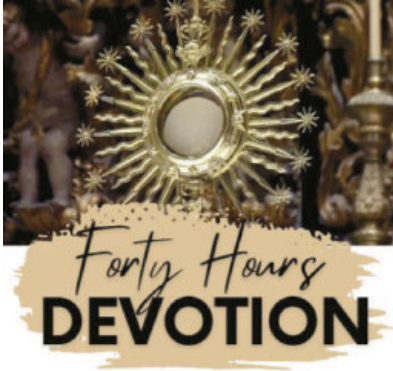

In the 40 Hours Devotion, the consecrated Eucharist is exposed on the altar in a monstrance for adoration for 40 hours. This devotion is not only a way to observe the National Eucharistic Revival; spending time in Adoration is also a way to observe the Feast of Corpus Christi on May 30th.

A Few Words about 40 Hours Devotion

I've been an insomniac as long as I can remember. It means that sometimes I have nights where I do a lot of reading on whatever topic is on my mind. Last May, I had seen something about preparations for Corpus Christi in Valencia, Spain and it stuck in the back of my head. So one night, when I probably should have been sleeping, I googled "Corpus Christi celebrations" and wow, were my eyes opened! Catholics around the world, celebrating the Eucharist—not just in Mass or in Adoration—but in processions through the streets. I reached out to Fr. Brian and Fr. Fernando and discovered that Fr. Fernando grew up with these sorts of processions, and while we didn't think we had the time to put one together, we celebrated the first of what would become our monthly Holy Hours with music; and we started thinking about the future.

A few weeks later, Fr. Brian sent out an email to the staff asking us to spend some time thinking and praying about how we could participate in the National Eucharistic Revival—an ongoing effort to revitalize the celebration of the Eucharist. There were many suggestions about how to expand opportunities within our current Adoration practice, but remembering our missed opportunity for a Corpus Christi procession, I suggested that this be the time to plan one. At a staff meeting, Fr. Brian announced the idea of a Forty Hours Devotion, followed by a Eucharistic Procession. It sounded amazing: what a way to come together as a community and celebrate the Eucharist through Adoration, prayer and song.

There were times I wasn't sure it was going to happen, but here we are, sharing the fruits of our planning with you today (see left facing page). Our intent is for this to become an annual tradition, with each collaborative parish taking a turn being as to where the opening and closing Masses are celebrated.

I'm sure looking at the schedule it can be intimidating, but no one's expecting any of us—even an insomniac like me—to be there for the whole Forty Hours Devotion. Instead, we ask each of you to prayerfully consider how you might be able to deepen your faith, to connect your family closer to the Eucharist, and be a part of this awesome celebration.

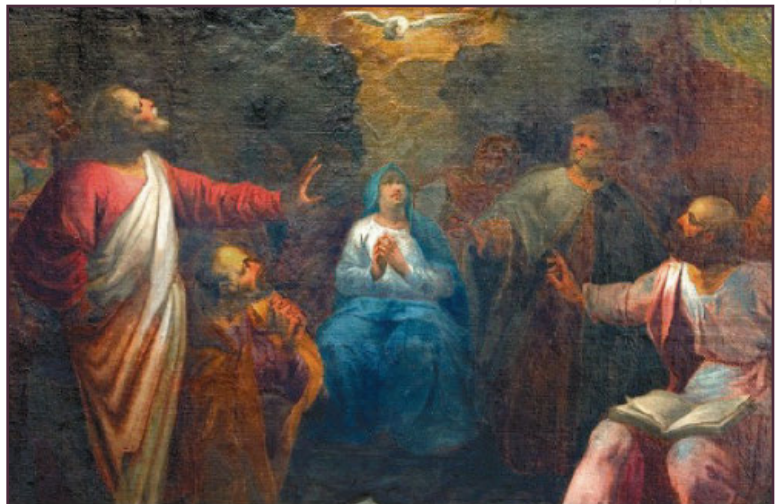
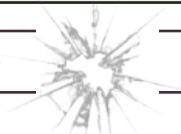
Saint Ambrose (d.397) wrote: "This is the person Christ has loved in loving you, the person he has chosen in choosing you. He enters by the open door, he has promised to come in, and he cannot deceive. Embrace him, the one you have sought, turn to him, and be enlightened, hold him fast, ask him not to go in haste, but beg him not to leave you. The word of God moves swiftly. He is not won by the lukewarm, nor held fast by the negligent. Let your soul be attentive to his word, follow carefully the path God tells you to take, for he is swift in his passing."

"Who but the holy Church is to teach you how to hold Christ fast? Indeed, she has already taught you, if you only understood her words in scripture: 'How short a time it was when I left them before I found him whom my soul has loved, I hold him fast, and I will not let him go.'"

How do we hold him fast? Not by restraining chains or knotted ropes but by bonds of love, by spiritual reins, by the longing of the soul."

The role of a bishop in the Church is rooted in his connection with the Apostolic Succession. The bishop's office was instituted by Christ through his appointing of the Twelve to continue his ministry. The apostles, in turn, appointed their

successors as Jesus intended. Like the Apostles, therefore, a bishop is called to preach the gospel, govern the Church, and sanctify the people of God. To be true to his calling, he must maintain the Apostolic Teaching in union with the Pope and the College of Bishops. The bishop, as a true man of integrity, recognizes that his call to leadership is not something innate to himself. Rather, it is through the power of the Holy Spirit that he is configured to Christ in the fullness of Christ's priesthood. As one of the two degrees of the priesthood, the bishop enjoys the fullness of the sacrament of Holy Orders. His ordination marks him indelibly, as *in persona Christi*. The connection that the bishop has with Christ is the summit of sacred ministry and accords him the fullness of sacramental power.

The most important endeavor of any bishop is to properly teach, or preach, the message of Christ. He, in union with the other bishops and the Pope, holds alone the teaching authority of the Lord, called the magisterium. The magisterium, in essence, has the authority or duty to maintain the unbroken, unchanging—and nchangeable—Apostolic Teaching. The Apostolic tradition is both rooted in *and* is the basis of the Gospel of Christ. Before the Gospels were written down the Apostles preached, and their preaching is what brought people to believe. That teaching of the Apostles came to be, in a sense, canonized in the four Gospels. How that teaching comes to be properly interpreted and proclaimed is maintained through the Apostolic tradition that continues in the teaching and preaching of the bishops. Hence, each bishop must teach, with unwavering conviction, the Gospel of Christ realizing that this teaching alone is what leads people to salvation. For when he preaches the Gospel, he expounds on the whole mystery of Christ, which is the divinely revealed way to give glory to God—ordered to attaining eternal happiness. And this is truly the whole basis and purpose of Church doctrine. The bishop must maintain fidelity to the teaching of the Church and proclaim Church doctrine, in order to help others know and understand who Christ truly is, what He did, and what it means for the salvation of all.

Good preaching and teaching should lead people to proper worship—the heart of a life lived in salvation. Christ's entire life was about leading us to worship God in the way that God intends for us to worship Him. The bishop, because he possesses the fullness of priestly power, represents most perfectly the mediation of Christ, in order to lead people in this worship of God.

Therefore, the bishop is appointed as representative before God in order to offer gifts and sacrifices both in the name of Christ and his people. An important aspect of the bishop being *in persona Christi* is the role he plays in and through his sanctifying office. Christ has chosen the bishops to lead his Church in every aspect of its existence; hence, the bishop is the ordinary minister of all the sacraments. He is the chief liturgist of his diocese and must ensure that the sacraments are well regulated and duly celebrated as Christ and the Church intends. And, for the bishop, of all the sacraments the celebration of the Eucharist must hold pride of place.

As the bishop leads through preaching/teaching and proper worship, he is also called to govern the Church in Christ's name. He does so in order to be like the Good Shepherd who came to serve, not to *be* served. The government of the Church is concerned with spiritual goods, with those of revelation, and with other matters closely connected with these spiritual goods and the faith. As a true successor of the Apostles, the bishop is *not* simply the branch manager of a diocese for the Pope. Rather, through his office, he holds all the rights and prerogatives necessary to lead the people of God entrusted to his care. He can make laws, command, judge, punish, and administrate as is needed for the good and edification of the flock. The good of the Lord's flock is always the supreme consideration in the choices a bishop makes. But, all must be regulated by the supreme authority of the Church: in other words, he cannot act contrary to the teaching or the universal laws of the Church.

God has chosen him to lead the people in order to continue the mission of Christ. He does this first and foremost by living his life in such a way that it is a n example of holiness in charity, humility, and simplicity of life. One cannot truly preach Christ if one is not living a life in accord with the mission of the Lord. And this is only possible if he has truly interiorized Christ through a living relationship with Jesus. And it is through this living relationship that he is able to convey to others the reality of the existence of Christ. He therefore stands in the midst of the people of God as one ready to serve them, and all who are open to hearing the truth of Christ. The bishop cannot be seen as one who is above the people but, rather, one who serves them; he is in their midst—like a good shepherd—walking with his people.

Next week we will look at presbyters (priests) and deacons.
