

God Alone!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



Having looked at the reasons why we should consecrate ourselves to Mary, now let us reflect on how we can do this. When you read the lives of the saints, a single pattern you will discern is a deep love for the Blessed Sacrament and a deep love for the Mother of our Lord. Some of the saints approached their love for the Mother of God by composing their own prayers of consecration to Mary. Others have followed the more ancient practice of Total Consecration to Mary as taught and promoted by St. Louis de Montfort. He himself solidified this holy practice from the French School of Spirituality, among whom are such prominent spiritual writers as Pierre Cardinal de Berulle, Fr. Charles de Condren, Fr. Jean-Jacques Olier, and St. Jean Eudes.

St. Louis de Montfort, who has been my spiritual father since my youth, wrote a book entitled *True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary*. In it he explains the important role that Mary has in God's plan of salvation and in the advance of the Kingdom of her Son. He then outlines for us, the substance of and the way to live out a true devotion to Mary. In its essence, it is a renewing of one's Baptismal promises in and through the Mother of God. It is a way to give everything one has, including all of one's spiritual and material goods to Mary, so that one may belong more fully to Jesus, Eternal Wisdom. In addition, by making this Consecration to Mary, one allows her to guide and arrange one's life according to the most perfect Will of God.

Having made this consecration when I was in high-school, I can testify to the fact that this is the simplest way to Jesus. It is the most freeing way to live, knowing that Mary has everything in her hands and that she arranges everything, she obtains every grace one needs, and that one's salvation has been entrusted into her loving protection. In the book of Genesis, we read how Rebecca obtains for her son Jacob, his father's blessing. Rebecca is a type of figure for Mary, who obtains for us the blessing of our heavenly Father. She secures the rights and safeguards the salvation of her Son for those who have entrusted everything of themselves to her. She is indeed a true Mother to those who place themselves in her loving care and protection.

If one wants to live and practice *True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary*, my recommendation would be to obtain a copy of St. Louis' book by the same name and to begin by reading it. Some of its phrases may seem out of place in modern parlance; however, one must bear in mind that St. Louis wrote using expressions that were common to seventeenth century France. Having read St. Louis' signature work, one can then follow the thirty-three day preparation guide found in the appendix of the book and pray the prayer of Consecration on the day of one's choosing.

Several modern saints have made this way of life their chosen path: to Jesus through Mary, including St. Maximilian Kolbe, St. Theresa of Calcutta, and St. John Paul II. We will take a closer look at the Consecration which St. Louis proposes next week. However, may the words of St. John Paul II inspire our hearts: "A work destined to become a classic of Marian spirituality was published 160 years ago. St Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort wrote the *Treatise on True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin* at the beginning of the 1700s, but the manuscript remained practically unknown for more than a century. When, almost by chance, it was at last discovered in 1842 and published in 1843, the work was an instant success, proving extraordinarily effective in spreading the "true devotion" to the Most Holy Virgin. I myself, in the years of my youth, found reading this book a great help...As is well known, my episcopal coat of arms...the motto *Totus tuus* is inspired by the teaching of St. Louis Marie Grignion de Montfort."




